THE ECLIPSE OF THE SUN AT FLINT ISLAND: PROFESSOR CAMPBELL'S CAMP.

The American party, under Professor Campbell, director of the famous Lick Observatory, California, U.S.A., numbered twelve scientists, and was camped quite close to where Mr. McClean had pitched his tents. The largest camera used was a giant (which may be seen in the background), with a forty foot focus, giving an image of about four and a half inches on the photographic plate.
