

The Cambria Park Stud Company advertise their stallions Obligado, Hierarch, and Orion for the coming season. Obligado, which is standing at a fee of 12g, is a beautifully bred horse, being by Ordville by Ormonde, from the Fair. Through both his sire and dam he descends from the great Agnes family, from which the great horses Ormonde, Kendall, Zinfandel, Martagon, and the famous mare Sceptre, Ornament, L'Abesne de Jouarre, and others descend. Obligado's opportunity at the stud has been so far a very limited character, but nevertheless his stock are practically all winners. The youngsters sired by Obligado since he had been located at Cambria Park possess plenty of fire, and are very sound, and are altogether a most promising lot. Hierarch is a young stallion, and during his short career on the turf (from which he was retired early owing to an unfortunate circumstance) gave promise of developing into a first-class race-horse. By the celebrated sire St. Simon, from Miss Annie (dam of Lady Annie, Cambrian, Annette, etc.), his pedigree shows an unbroken line of the most successful running blood. A few months ago he was mated with a mare sired by Hierarch last year (his first season at the stud), and his foals are a beautiful lot. Hierarch's fee is 10g, which is ridiculously low for a horse of his breeding.

The death of the 1897 Melbourne Cup winner Gaulus means a serious loss to his owner, Mr. W. G. Coughran, of Casino, Bay, "Martini," in the New Zealand Cup. According to the wire received, the horse died from hemorrhage of the stomach on August 23. Gaulus was bred by Mr. J. R. Smith at Tucka Tucka in 1881, and was by Gogo (from) from Industry by Mueket from (from) from Voltaire by Blane from Seakale. Trained by the late Mr. William Forrester, one of the best finishers ever witnessed for a Melbourne Cup was that in 1897 between the own brothers Gaulus and Aurora, both trained in the one stable. The former, both trained in the one stable, was with them, but they beat him, and after a desperate battle Gaulus, the cheetah, won by a short head. The value of the Cup won that year was £3418, which, added to the Hawksbury Autumn and Totehill Cup which placed £3008 in that year's winning list to his credit. At the end Gaulus has not sired any what may be called great horses, but a number of good ones. Perhaps his best, though we never have seen the horse really try, was the matter of condition, the British King, who had he not been bit troublesome at the post, and thus been debarr'd in a great measure from racing in rich stakes, would have done more than win Regt Cups and like stakes at country places. His other horses, Ubbah, Hon. Carracig Gwydir, and Glic could all gallop, while only last Saturday a daughter of Gaulus-Zillah—carried top weight and won the Hurdle Race at Wagon.

The one absorbing theme of the Marton meeting (writes "General" in the "Palmerston Times") was the disqualification of the New Zealand Cup candidate Frisco and his owner, Mr. F. Bremer, together with the club, for inconsistent running. As is generally known, Frisco was last in the Short's Handicap on the first day, but on the second day he was entrusted with a weight ten times that amount in the Telegraph Handicap; and, despite the fact that Karoro, one of the fastest geldings on the coast, got away with a break of anything from 10 to 12 lengths, Frisco went down with a broken neck. His performance in the late Palmerston North Stakes at Awapuni in December last, when Oxton and Sir Wilton got away with a 20-length break, Frisco was just unable to get up and winning by half a length in the last bit. At the half-mile post, and almost at the home turn, it seemed an impossibility for Frisco to win; but galloping two to Karoro's one, the son of Warwick the New Zealand Cup, who is a hardy rice by length and a-half. It was this very sterling nature of the performance that drew pointed attention to the horse's position in the Short's Handicap on the first day, and a protest was generally expected. It was not long in coming, Mr. Bremer, owner of Karoro, putting it to the Press was not admitted to the subsequent inquiry, but it would be idle to say that they forgot to protest. The protest was expressed at the decision, and the pros and cons of the whole affair were afterwards argued in most animated style in different parts of the paddock. As may be imagined, there were many who thought the decision arrived at was a harsh one, but the general consensus of opinion was that the stewards had done what the circumstances demanded of them, and that their action was of exceptional merit. There were not wanting expressions of regret at the same time that so fine a horse should be in all probability debarred from winning part this year in the big handicap of the Dominion New Zealand Cup, which it will be remembered, he won last year. It was a somewhat peculiar happening that the stewards were so engrossed in their deliberations with regard to the horse and even that they forgot to protest. The part taken by the rider, A. Oliver, in the matter, and a subsequent meeting was held to determine his fate. As Oliver had ridden Frisco each day, it was after the first decision, he forced to resign, and a meeting would be meted out to him, viz., disqualification during the pleasure of the club, and that sentence was imposed.

TURF TALK FROM THE SOUTH.

CHRISTCHURCH, Friday. Continuous fine weather is telling on the training at Riccarton, and an hour's steady rain would benefit them greatly just at present. A large number of horses are being worked, including about twenty two-year-olds. Of the latter, Cutler is the most forward, and the best of them should be greatly in evidence at the Spring meeting. From what I have seen of their work, I should take Broadwood, a full brother to Fleetfoot, as the speediest of them. Felix, a colt by St. Amrose from the same sire, trained by the same owner, has just won a lot of races. It is yet too early to form any definite opinion as to the respective merits of the juveniles, for those that appear to most advantage at present are not yet in the matter of condition. All Red registered an attractive performance by winning the Horowhenua Cup under Oct. Though not engaged in the New Zealand Cup, the brother to Muncie is bound to be a promising part in the principal shorter distance events at the Canterbury Jockey Club's Metropolitan meeting. At a special committee meeting of the (Anterbury) Jockey Club, held on Wednesday, the disqualification for two months inflicted on J. T. Green and Pretty Nell by the Ambarley Steeplechase Club was withdrawn, as was three months' disqualification of D. Price, who rode the mare in her two races at the August meeting. W. H. McKay has been retained to ride Riffendale in the New Zealand Cup, while A. Hatch will have the mount on Moiche. It is stated that California will be a competitor in the New Zealand Steeplechase, after which he may be taken over to Australia. No less than fifty yearlings have been nominated for the North Otago Jockey Club Special Stakes, including ten sires from all the principal South Island stables. The Elderslie stud contributes fourteen, Sir Geo. Clifford five, and the Hon. McLean four, while Messrs. Wand, G. Stead, Buckle, and Buchanan have two or more each. The Dunedin Jockey Club has not been over fortunate in regard to its Dunedin Stakes and Champagne Stakes. Liberal entries were received for both races, but, after declaration of the second forfeits, only nine stand the ground in the Dunedin Stakes, while nineteen in the Champagne Stakes. Sir Geo. Clifford's Broadwood, by Clansmaid—Safeguard, which is looked on as the smartest two-year-old at Riccarton, is in both events, while the Hon. Geo. McLean is represented by a prominent pair in Wabun, by Stepulak Yentosa, and Multifoli, by Multifoli—Lady Kossign. Indications point to the fields in both races being below the average. After his exertions at the National meeting, Lupulite lightened up considerably. The short respite has caused him to fall out again, and he will be a competitor at the Ashburton R.C.'s meeting next week. The three-year-old half-sister by Obligado to Lupulite is again with McKay's team at Riccarton. As a two-year-old she was a splendid-legged, polished thing, but latterly has filled and thickened out a good deal. She will always be smallish, but her chance of making even a modest racer does not look so remote as it did last year. The Gordon mare, Disappointment, which won races last season, is in work again at Riccarton. W. Young will have the mount on Tangimona in the New Zealand Cup. The daughter of San Fran is being given a solid preparation for the big race, and is standing up to her work well.

AVONDALE JOCKEY CLUB'S SPRING MEETING.

A special meeting of the Auckland Racing Club Committee was held last Monday (the Hon. E. Mitchell presiding) to consider the report of the sub-committee in connection with the programmes for the forthcoming season. With a few minor alterations it was decided to practically adhere to last year's programme, the prize money totalling £25,800. It was decided to transfer the Hunt Club Cup and Hurdle Race from the spring to the winter meeting, substituting the Avondale Handicap and Hunters' Steeplechase. On the second day of the winter meeting the Tally-ho Steeplechase has been abolished, and a Ladies' Bracket substituted. The classic event, the Great Northern Hunt Stakes, has been increased to 600-sovs, and the Great Northern Champagne Stakes to 500-sovs, an increase of 150-sovs and 50-sovs respectively.
