Shipping at Greenough. (5) The State mine at Dunblie. The dispute between the men employed in the Point Elizabeth coal mine and the Department, having come to an end, had always been done by the miners in the Point Elizabeth colliery, as well as in every other mine on the West Coast. To concede the demand of the men that the Department should pay 22s. The wages already earned by the miners, approximately 14s. per day, for a shift of seven hours, were fair and reasonable, and could not be increased at the expense of the public without approval ever known in the Dominion's history. If the Government fails to take speedy action, Mr. W. E. Parry, president of the Waikato Miners' Union, observes, that the State miners, many of the men only making from 6s. to 8s. per day.
