



A FAMOUS JUMPER—MR. J. H. DALTON'S "LA GRIPPE."

The above horse was one of the best-known horses that followed the Pakuranga Hounds, and was acknowledged to be one of the best jumpers New Zealand has ever seen. He is credited with having jumped a galvanised iron fence 7 feet high, and as a long jumper he had no equal in the world, having jumped 40 feet 6 inches, or 2 feet 6 inches more than the world's record. At the last Auckland Agricultural Show he was awarded First Prize as Heavy-Weight Hunter. He originally came from the East Coast, and was by "Maori," out of a half-bred mare. He is now dead, having sustained an injury at the last Floral Fete from which he never recovered.
