



This very graceful gown is made of pearl grey union over heliotrope crepon, with shadow embroidery and lace veiled by the tunic and a huge black satin bow above the trained skirt. A most graceful gown of that specially pretty shade of heliotrope crepon which blends well with a certain pearl-grey, of which colour is the union that composes the overdress. The gown has a train, which is a relief after the curtailed models, and is trimmed with mauve shadow embroidery and bands of grey lace, veiled by the tunic, and a very huge black satin bow, posed low upon the skirt. In the hat with the crumpled brim, a grey hat with a band of black velvet, there are grey, purple, and black roses. A characteristic of much of the new millinery is the erratic contour of the brim, which is pinched up here and there to suit each wearer's beauty.



When wearing mammoth millinery, the girl with a small, plump countenance should choose a model with a mass of flowers or tulle, or perchance both, to heighten the crown and give length to her face.

These striped muslins have in themselves so decorative an effect that they need little or nothing in the way of trimming. They look best of all made up over white satin and arranged with easels of black satin ribbon. The bodices are suitably finished with chemisettes and under-sleeves of the finest kind of Irish crochet lace, and, to complete the picture, there should be a large hat in black crinoline, trimmed with long white ostrich feathers.
