

THE COMPLETION OF ANOTHER LINK IN THE NORTH AUCKLAND RAILWAY SYSTEM.

The opening of the Kawakawa-Towal section of the Whangarel Railway marked an important advance for the North of Auckland. The linking up of this gap has established communication between Opina, in the Bay of Islands, and Whangarel, in the South. The line is now being pushed on from Souria Flat, and in his opening speech the Hon, Jas. Carroll prophesied that this section would be completed within eighteen months, and five years would see the milway right through to Hokkings. At present only a tri-weekly service is being rnn from Whangarel to Opina but in view of the increasing traffic the Department is being arged by the settlers to run a daily service. The opening ceremony, which rook place on April 13th, was performed by the Arti-Prender, Hon, Jas. Carroll, who was presented by the County Chairman (Mr. II.
