




Last week the Union Co.'s damaged sheatter Takapuna was taken up on the Wellington patent slip for the purpose of having the damaged portion of her hull sighted, it will be remembered that the vessel sustained injury whilst entering the Buffer River. The full extent of the damage could not be assertated until last week, when it was found that her stern post was bent, but can be straightened, and the rudder-shock broken. The rudder fiself was bent at the top where it enters the aperture, and the after-frame was bent two feet on of line. Two plates will have to be removed from the linth and renewed, and the propeller required to be fitted with three new blades.
