Their home was about 14 miles from Taiton, and soon after their arrival they were informed that their two boys had been shot in the leg, and were being held in a few hours.



SIR ROBERT STOUT'S MISSION TO BARONGUA

The photo shows a number of those present at the big "koro" held soon after the arrival of Sir Robert Stout and Mr. Widdicomb, Under-Secretary for Justice. Sir Robert Stout was appointed to make inquiries into the administration of Government at Barongua, and to preside at a murder trial, in which a white peevish named Waimoro was accused of killing a native. Waimoro was found guilty of manslaughter, and sentenced to six months' imprisonment. The photo shows Mr. Widdicomb reading a message from Sir James Carnot, the Acting Premier.
