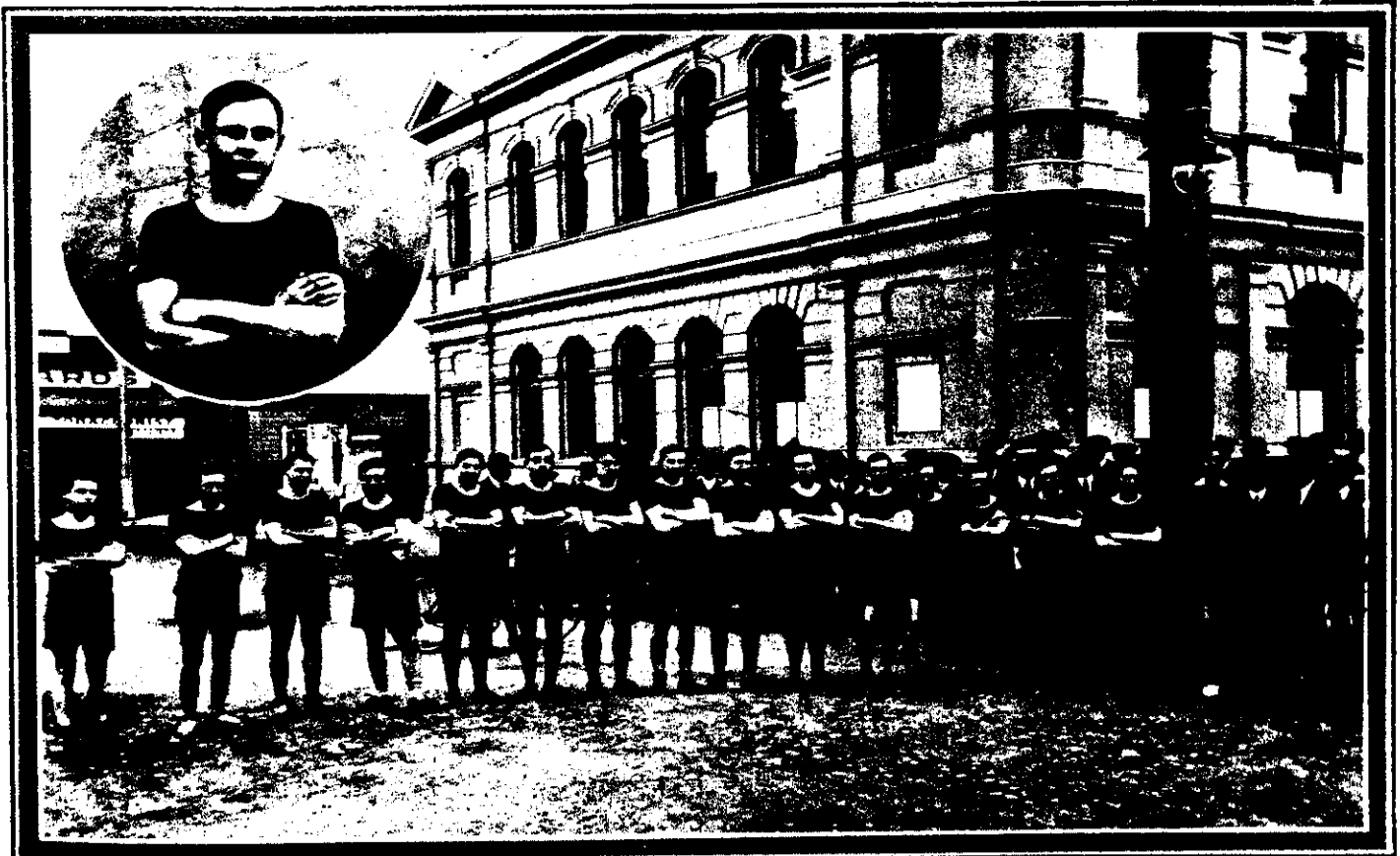

LOSS OF THE STAR OF CANADA—VESSEL WILL PROBABLY BE ABANDONED.

The Tynes liner Star of Canada, which went a-bore recently at Gisborne, is now reported to have her back broken. In all probability she will be abandoned to the underwriters, the latest reports indicating that the position of the stranded vessel is daily growing more serious. At high tide last Saturday some 20 ft of the forward deck was awash. Lightering of the cargo has been completed, and the vessel is now practically an empty ship. The illustration shows her position on the reef, and how she has gone down by the bows.
