



A BIG WORK COMPLETED.—SOME OF THE ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES OF THE NEW FERRY BUILDINGS IN AUCKLAND.

The handsome look of the new Ferry Buildings, which stands at the foot of Queen Street at the commencement of the new ferry-concrete wharf, is a decided acquisition to the public buildings of the city. The new building is practically completed, and is already in partial occupation. (1) The main passage on the second floor, running from one end of the building to the other. (2) The archways along the waterfront. (3) A view of the new Ferry Buildings, showing the old Northcote and Barkhaleid Ferry Offices alongside.
