Chief Detective Marsack, of Auckland, who has been promoted to the rank of Sub-inspector, and appointed to the Palmerston North Station.



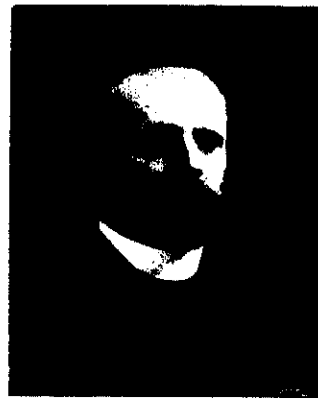

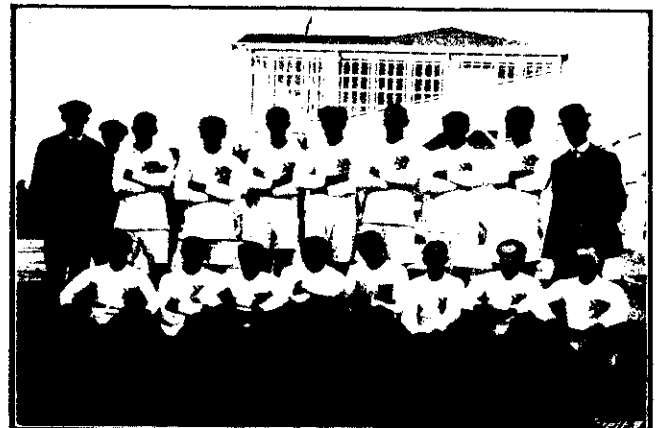


AUCKLAND'S NEW CHIEF-DETECTIVE.
