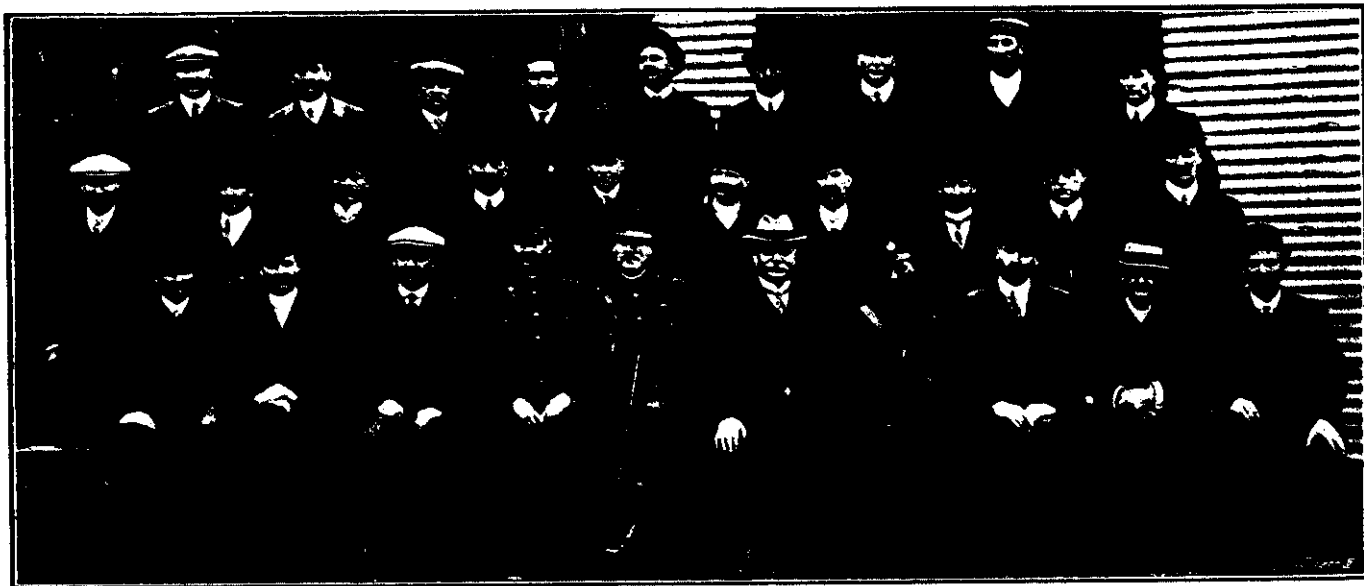




LADY CAMPBELL SOON FOLLOWS HER HUSBAND.—THE LAST OF A VENERABLE COUPLE.

The death occurred on Sunday morning at her residence, "Kilbride," Paru, of Lady Campbell, widow of the late Sir John Logan Campbell. Lady Campbell, who was in her 77th year, had been in failing health for a considerable time, and since the death of her husband had been slowly sinking. She was a daughter of Sir John Cracroft Wilson, K.C. S.L., judge of Moradabad, who afterwards settled in New Zealand, and was married to the late Sir John Logan Campbell at Lucknow in 1858.
