


Northward, photo. NEW ZEALAND'S NORTHERN WIRELESS STATION.

EVERY PART OF THE EMPIRE WITHIN CALL.

The ring of wireless stations to be established around the British Empire is here indicated. Six stations decided upon some months ago include England, Egypt, Aden, Hongkong, Pretoria, and Singapore, and should be working next year. The Marconi Company has contracted with the Imperial Government to construct the stations, each with a radius of 2,000 miles of buildings and foundations. All stations will be high-powered, working day and night.
