

Wheeler and Co., place. ON THE SHORES OF MANAPOURI-THE DEEPEST LAKE IN NEW ZEALAND.

The flues; and grandest of all the lakes in New Zealand, situated in the Otago and Southland districts, are Lakes Wakatipu 1999ff above sea-level and 52 unles long; Rere Lake, off Lake Wakatipu; Wanaka, 30 unles long, 300ff above sea level; Hawea, 17 miles long, 100fff above sea level; Te Anau (the largest lake in the South Island), 32 unles long, and from one to six unles wide; and Manapouri, 13 unles south of Te Anau, a lake of twists and turns, bays and arms; It is, moreover, the deepest lake in New Zealand (1.438ff), going considerably below sea level.
