ON THE SHORES OF MANAPOURI—THE DEEPEST LAKE IN NEW ZEALAND.

The finest and grandest of all the lakes in New Zealand, situated in the Otago and Southland districts, are Lakes Wakatipu 1000ft above sea-level and 32 miles long; Rere Lake, off Lake Wakatipu; Wanaka, 30 miles long, 630ft above sea level; Hawea, 17 miles long, 1062ft above sea level; Te Anau (the largest lake in the South Island), 23 miles long, and from one to six miles wide; and Manapouri, 13 miles south of Te Anau, a lake of twists and turns, bays and arms; it is, moreover, the deepest lake in New Zealand (1,458ft), going considerably below sea level.
