NATIVE'S DISQUALIFICATION.

The Hon. J. D. Omond and Messrs. G.
Hunter and C. P. Skerrett, K.C. Judges
appointed by the Racing Conference,
heard appeals lodged by Mr. Timi Purn,
owner of The Native, and C. Price, Jockey,
against the disqualification of the
stewards of the horse and rider for alleged
jostling in the New Zealand Grand National
Hurdle Race at Riccarton last August.

The report of the judges is as follows:—
With reference to the appeal of Mr.
Jaund, Bull Club, the decision of the
stewards of the Canterbury Jockey Club, and from the decision of the
Canterbury Jockey Club District Committee,
we are of opinion that, as an allegation
has been made by Mr. Jaund that he was not
afforded a fair opportunity to have the
evidence of the witnesses he named taken
before the stewards, the appeal should be
allowed, and that the stewards of the
Canterbury Jockey Club should be given
the opportunity of answering the allegation.
We direct that the stewards shall supply
to the judges the minutes of the proceed-
ings taken at the inquiry. We further direct
that the names of the evidence taken
before us shall be available to the
stewards."
