

WHERE THE FATAL CONFLICT BETWEEN THE WAIHI STRIKERS AND ARBITRATIONISTS TOOK PLACE.

(1) Some of the leading spirits of the Arbitrationisis' Union. Third from the left, in the front row, is the president, Mr. Rudd. On the extreme left of the photo is the door through which the arbitrationists forced their way into the hall. The first shots were fired through this door, a worker manual Johnston being shot in the leg. (2) The redoubtable "Cocky" in the centre, and two of his pats. "Cocky" is credited with having had more individual fights than any other man in Waibl. (3) A monitorial converse outside the newly-captured Miners' Union Hall. (4) A pulse patrol, in the background is the Miners' Union Hall, showing the Union Jack and Red Easign, which the workers holsted in place of the red day of the Federationists.
