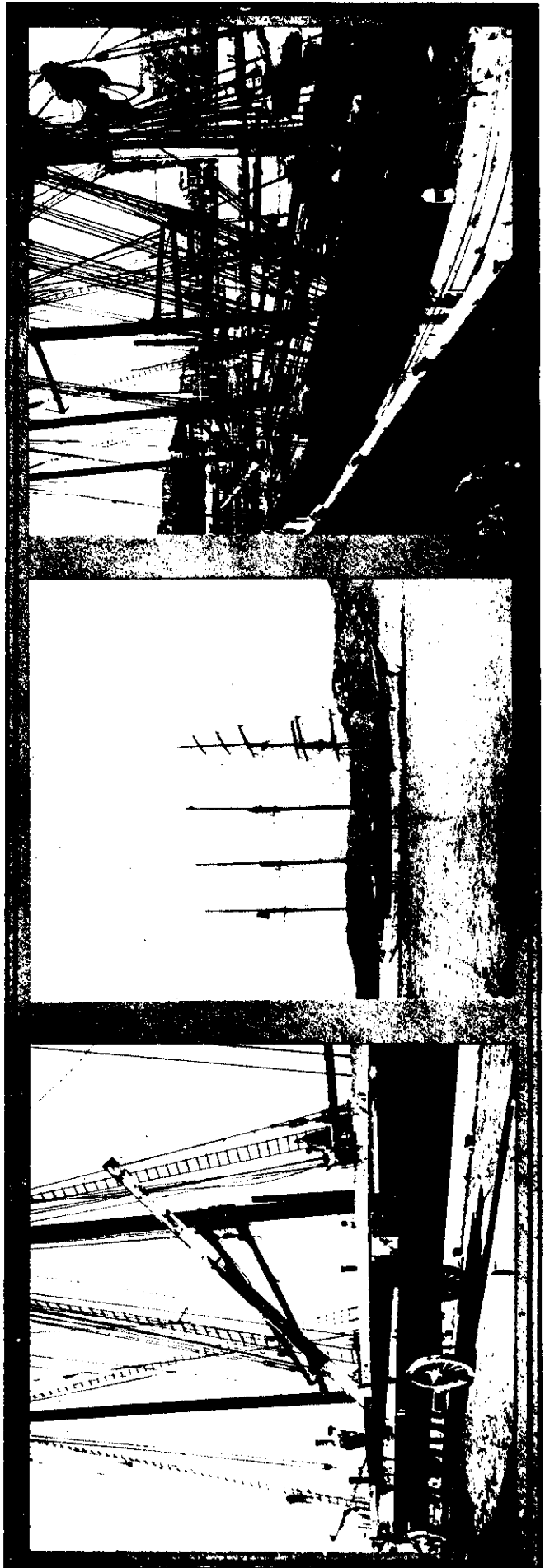

The American lumbering Koko Head, which arrived in Wellington last week with 1,445,000 ft. of Oregon pine, made a brisk passage from Portland, covering the 7,000-mile journey in 45 days. Some anxiety is felt concerning the safety of the Robert H. Wood (a four-masted schooner belonging to the same company), which left Grace Harbour, Washington, 29 days ahead of the Koko Head, and is now over 80 days out.
