The Racing Conference

BUSINESS PROGRAMME.

The following is the business card of the Racing Conference to be held at Christchurch on the 7th inst.:

RESOLUTION FROM THE CONFERENCE HELD AT WELLINGTON 25TH JULY, 1894.

1. "That the reduction of one-third of the licenses granted for the use of the totalisator be made in each Metropolitan District, and that the representatives of each Metropolitan District bring up a scheme for submission to the Conference, showing the reductions proposed in their several districts."

NOTICES OF MOTION.

AUCKLAND RACING CLUB'S REPRESENTATIVES TO MOVE—

1. "That the sum of £600 mentioned in clause 4 of Rule 22 shall be altered to the sum of £500; that the sum of £500 mentioned in clause 5 of said Rule 22 shall be altered to £400; that the sum of £300 mentioned in clause 6 of said Rule 22 shall be altered to the sum of £200. Provided always that the foregoing rules shall only apply to clubs holding meetings distant at least 20 miles from a Metropolitan racecourse."

2. "That Rule No. 167 shall not apply to a meeting at which the totalisator shall not be used."

3. "That Rule 63 be altered to read 'Any person entering an unnamed horse if of the age of two years or over shall pay a penalty of £5 for every time he shall so enter such horse.'"

4. "That the fees at present paid to jockeys in accordance with the provisions of Rule 169 are generally too high, and that the Conference take into consideration some scheme for the adoption of a lower scale."

5. "That the Conference define the meaning of a 'hack.'"

6. "A name may be claimed for a horse either by entry or publication, as mentioned in the foregoing rules, or at any time by sending the pedigree to the registry office. An owner or nominator shall not be allowed to claim a name for a horse if any other horse in New Zealand shall have been previously known by the said name, whether such horse shall be distinguished by the addition to the same of numerals or otherwise. If the same name is proposed or claimed for two or more horses at the same time the order of priority shall be determined by lot by the committee of the club. Any person entering a horse in contravention of this rule shall be liable to a fee not exceeding £50." W. PERCIVAL, Secretary.

AUCKLAND COUNTRY CLUBS' REPRESENTATIVE TO MOVE—

1. "That the following alterations be made in Rule 22 as added money per diem in stakes:— 'Clause V.—That the words four hundred pounds be substituted for five hundred pounds.' 'Clause VI.—That the words two hundred pounds be substituted for three hundred pounds.' 'Clause VII.—That the words one hundred pounds be substituted for one hundred and fifty pounds.'"

2. "That Rule 39 be altered to read as follows:— 'At any meeting held on any date from the 31st of May to the 1st of September the lowest weight in any race on the flat shall not be less than 9st.'"

3. "That no nomination or acceptance shall be void in case of telegraphic interruption, provided that such nomination or acceptance shall be proved to have been lodged at any telegraph station one hour before the advertised time of closing of such nominations or acceptances."

4. "That all moneys received by Metropolitan Clubs for penalties, fines, and riding licenses shall be placed to the credit of a 'Distressed Jockeys Fund.'"

5. "That all moneys received by Metropolitan Clubs for trainers' licenses shall be placed to the credit of a 'Distressed Trainers Fund.'"

6. "That all moneys placed to the credit of a Distressed Jockeys' Fund or a Distressed Trainers' Fund shall be annually accounted for by the Metropolitan Clubs, and a printed statement showing the receipts and expenditure and investments of all moneys, shall be submitted at the annual meetings of such clubs."

7. "That in the event of any horse being accidentally disabled after being weighed out, or before being taken in hand by the starter, such horse shall be deemed a non-starter."

8. "No horse shall be barred on the totalisator."

9. "That all meetings of Conferences be open to the Press."

CANTERBURY COUNTRY CLUBS' REPRESENTATIVES TO MOVE—

1. "That section 6 of Rule 22 be altered to read—'Any Club holding two meetings in the year must give an average of at least two hundred and fifty pounds per diem in stakes.'"

2. "That the following words be added to Rule 29—'The stewards shall also have power to summon witnesses, and anyone disobeying such summons shall be fined or disqualified.'"

3. "That sections 3 and 10 of Rule 193 be altered so as to allow time to give notice of motion after meeting has been called."

4. "That section 5 of Rule 193 be altered so as to read—'No business shall be transacted at any Conference unless representatives of at least seven clubs be present.'"

5. "That section 11 be altered so that the proportional voting of Metropolitan and Country Clubs shall be more fairly adjusted, as follows:— 'Metropolitan Clubs to remain as at present. The combined Country Clubs of Auckland, Otago, and Canterbury Districts, 3 votes each; Wellington and Hawke's Bay, 2 votes each; Wanganui and Taranaki, 1 vote each; Nelson, Marlborough, and Greymouth (combined), 2 votes.'"

6. "That the word 'Metropolitan' be omitted from section 12, and that the expenses shall include travelling expenses of members attending Conference."

DUNEDIN JOCKEY CLUB'S REPRESENTATIVES TO MOVE—

1. "All disputes referred to the Club will be adjudged according to the published rules, where any of them are applicable to the case submitted to them, and where not according to the established Rules of Racing. The racing laws of the Jockey Club of Newmarket as existing at present, and all alterations made from time to time, shall be adopted by the Club as far as practicable."

2. "That sub-section vi., of Rule 167A, be altered to read as follows:— 'Any owner or trainer who shall knowingly employ an unlicensed jockey, or any trainer who shall train without a license or permit, shall be fined any sum not exceeding twenty pounds each.'"

HAWKES BAY JOCKEY CLUB'S REPRESENTATIVES TO MOVE—

1. Rule 2 be altered to read: "Race includes a plate or sweepstake, but does not refer to a Steeplechase, Hurdle Race, or Hunter's Race on the flat."

2. Rule 39, that the following words be added, "and no Steeplechase shall be run from the 15th November to the 30th April."

3. "That no horse shall carry less than 7st. in any handicap on the flat."

4. "That the passing of the Gaming Act during the last session of Parliament necessitates the formation of a New Zealand Jockey Club, and that immediate steps be taken to give effect to this resolution."

5. Proposals will be made to alter the present mode of conducting the Official Calendar.

Rule 21, "That all words after the word 'racecourse' be struck out."

OTAGO COUNTRY CLUBS' REPRESENTATIVES TO MOVE—

1. "That rule 128 should read the same as the English rule 169, sub-section IV."

2. "That rule 158, sub-section D, Victorian rules, be added to the N.Z. rules. Any persons wishing to ride in a race on even terms with jockeys shall obtain permission from the Stewards before doing so."

3. "That the number of Stewards at a race-meeting shall be limited to 5 (five), and no judge, starter, or other official shall act as steward."

WANGANUI JOCKEY CLUB'S REPRESENTATIVES TO MOVE—

1. "That a fee of £1 is shall be charged for all gentlemen riders' certificates, such fee to go to the credit of Distressed Jockeys Fund."

2. "That no hurdle race in the Colony be under one mile and half, and no steeplechase be under two miles."

3. "That in the event of a horse winning a handicap of the value of £100 after the declaration of weights, the handicapper be allowed to review that horse's weight and raise it or allow it to stand, as he thinks fit. It is only winners that this motion is intended to affect."

WANGANUI COUNTRY CLUBS' REPRESENTATIVE TO MOVE—

1. "That the Metropolitan Committees be constituted in the future by the present Metropolitan Club electing six members, and the Country Clubs of such district seven members."

2. "That a New Zealand Jockey Club be formed, to consist of five members, to be elected by the Metropolitan Committees as above constituted."

3. "If the Conference be continued as at present, that the Country Clubs in the Wanganui District have the right of electing two members to that body, instead of one, as at present."

WELLINGTON COUNTRY CLUBS' REPRESENTATIVES TO MOVE—

1. Rule 178A, "Should a jockey or apprentice give notice in writing (stating particulars) to any Racing Club that an owner or trainer having horses engaged at the meeting is owing him money for riding fees or wages, the Stewards, upon satisfactory evidence being given, shall have power to stop the said owner or trainer from starting any horse entered by him till such fees or wages have been paid."

2. New Rule "That when the totalisator is not used Hunt Clubs be allowed to hold steeplechase meetings on any racecourse after having been granted permission, and with the consent of the Metropolitan Club."
