Gipsy King is a bright bay, with black points, standing over 16 hands 1 inch, symmetrically and powerfully built, and is a true type of the weight-carrying thoroughbred horse, and may be more aptly described as a "tower of equine strength." His temper and disposition is also one of his many good points. His performances on the turf (vide appendix) at all distances and weights were of sterling merit, and proved him to be a first-class racehorse, and the fact that he ran into a place overy time he started, with one exception, is sufficient proof that he was gifted with a great dash of pace, stamina, courage, and a grand constitution. In all he started 16 times, his record being 7 firsts, 6 seconds, 2 thirds, and only once unplaced.

In placing Gipsy King at the service of breeders in the Hawera district probably for the last season the owners have every confidence in claiming that the horse has stood a thorough test as a stud horse, and the stock he has left—upstanding, strongly built, good looking horses, showing quality and substance—are a credit to so young a sire, and is an indication that he has the gift of transmitting his own goodness to his progeny. Like many other thorough bred stallions, Gipsy King has only served a limited number of well-bred nares, yet with these few chances he has produced several winners, and a number of his progeny now in training give every promise of distinguishing themselves this season.

Those of his stock that have run prominently are Dart, Bush Boy, The Hero, Vagrant, Storm King, Hesitation, Kanhu, and Steel King. The three former have won races both in New Zealand and Australia. At the Victoris Racing Club's National Meeting Dart ran second to Daimosaid to be the best steeplechase horse in the Australian colonies—in the V.R.C. Grand National Steeplechase of 1000 sovs, after which Dart was sold for 370 guineas and Bush Boy was passed in at 250 guineas. Last racing season Gipsy King's stock won in New Zealand 4466, and Le Loup's stock won 5978. Nearly all Gipsy King's progeny have a penchant for cross-country racing, and as this class of horse finds a ready sale-breedersshoud study their own interests, and breed what they can sell.

Thoroughbred mares with or without foals will be taken the gracest care of, and all visiting mares will be placed in well grassed paddocks.

It will be noticed that Seaton Delaval is full of the most fushionable and best-staying English blood, and it is therefore not surprising that he was a stayer of the first water. Seaton Delaval won as a two-year-old, as a three-year-old, and as a four-year-old, and quitted the turf in 1894, as a five-year-old, sound in wind and limb. For quality and beauty of outline it would indeed be difficult to match him, and he ought to be a most successful stallion. The more noteworthy of the many triumphs were winning the Great Northern Handicap of £500 at York, distance 13 mile, and the Great Northumberland Plate of £1,000, at Newcastle, 2 miles, and in this race he beat the winners of the Chester Cup, of the Manchester Cup, and of the City and Suburban. He also ran second in the Great Metropolitan Stake at Epsom, 2‡ miles; only beaten a head; and in that race head behind him the winners of the Great Yorkshire Handicap, of the Goodwood Stakes, and of the Northamptonshire Stakes. The London Sportsman of December 19, 1894, writes as follows:—"As a son of the very successful sire Melton, a good-looking, sound horse, and a rare stayer, Seaton Delaval is pretty sure to make his mark at the stud, and, indeed, it is a long time since so good a horse was sent to New Zealand."

Melton was sold some years back to the Italian Government for £10,000, and English breeders have ever since been regretting that he was allowed to leave the country, as his stock have been uniformly successful. Owing to his being abroad, there were no two-year-olds to represent him in 1894, but in reviewing the racing season of that year, the London Times of December 14th last says:—"Melton, with 23 winners of over £13,000, should be given precedence over Wisdom, for Best Mar, who won 8 races, is undoubtedly his son, and as Melton's progeny have won £25,000 in the last two seasons, and have included such animals as Best Man, Avington, Bullingdon, and Indian Queen, it is easy to understand the regret felt at his being exported to Italy."


