PROGRAMME.

- Maiden Trot Handicap (saddle) of 15 sovs; second horse to receive 3 sovs from the stakes. Nomination 10s, acceptance 5s. For horses that have never won an advertised trot, either in saddle or harness, at time of starting. Two miles. To start at 12 noon.
Manawatu Trot Handicap (saddle) of 50 sovs; second horse to receive 7 sovs, and the third horse 3 sovs from the stakes. Nomination 20s, acceptance 30s. Three miles. To start at 12.45 p.m.
Handicap Pony Trot (harness) of 20 sovs; second pony to receive 5 sovs from the stakes. Height 14.2 and under. Nomination 10s, acceptance 10s. Two miles. To start at 1.30 p.m.
Maiden Trot Handicap (harness) of 15 sovs; second horse to receive 3 sovs from the stakes. For horses that have never won an advertised trot, either in saddle or harness, at the time of starting. Nomination 10s, acceptance 5s. Two miles. To start at 2.15 p.m.
Summer Trot Handicap (harness) of 50 sovs; second horse to receive 7 sovs, and the third horse 3 sovs from the stakes. Nomination 20s, acceptance 30s. Three miles. To start at 3 p.m.
Handicap Pony Trot (saddle) of 20 sovs; second pony to receive 5 sovs from the stakes. Height 14.2 and under. Nomination 10s, acceptance 10s. Two miles. To start at 3.45 p.m.
Electric Trot Handicap (saddle) of 25 sovs; second horse to receive 5 sovs from the stakes. Nomination 10s, acceptance 15s. One mile. To start at 4.30 p.m.

DATES OF NOMINATIONS, HANDICAPS, AND ACCEPTANCES.

Nominations close with the Secretary on SATURDAY, December 7th, at 9 p.m. Handicaps will be declared on SATURDAY, December 14th. Acceptances close on SATURDAY, December 21st, at 9 p.m. All Nominations and Acceptances must be accompanied by the necessary fees. On no account will horses be handicapped whose nomination fees are unpaid.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

All ponies must be measured before starting. Nominators must state the bona fide owner of horses. Previous performances of the horses to be given at time of nomination, also colours of the riders. All horses must be ridden and driven out. If distanced by first horse, second and third money will be paid to the winner. All protests must be accompanied by a fee of 2 sovs, to be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. All disputes and objections arising out of the racing shall be decided by a majority of stewards present, whose decision shall be final, and shall not be questioned in any court of law. Entries only received on this condition. To be run under the Rules of the North Island Trotting Association of New Zealand. Five per cent will be deducted from the gross amount of all stakes.

Balista was a brilliant mare, and won many races, and is own sister to those good performers Artillery and Hilda, and three-quarter sister to Strathmore, Hazel, and Brown Alice.

Orion's Belt won the Hawke's Bay Nursery Handicap and Napier Park Sapling Stakes Handicap.

Hazel won the Great Autumn Handicap, one mile and a half, in the record time for New Zealand, beating a first-class field.

A BAY COLT, by Hotchkiss out of Formo, by Sterlingworth (imp.) out of Pulehra (imp.), by Rosicrucian out of the great English Formosa, winner of the One Thousand Guineas, Oaks, and St. Leger, and dead heat for the Two Thousand Guineas. A BROWN COLT, by Cuirassier out of Lilac, by Leolinus (imp.) out of Leila (imp.), by Bucco-neer, sire of the renowned Kincaid.
A BROWN FILLY, by Cuirassier (full brother to the great Trenton), out of Sunrise by Rama Rama out of Awatea by Ravensworth (imp.), out of Skybird (imp.), by Teddington, winner of English Derby.
A BROWN FILLY, by Cuirassier out of Ouida, by Yattendon, dam of those great performers, Artillery, Hilda, Balista, Strathmore, Hazel, and Brown Alice.
