STAND AT WELLINGTON PARK:-

CASTOR (imp.) by Zealot son of the famous sire Hermit, winner of the Derby, 1887) out of Lady Yardley, by the great Sterling (sire of Lsonomy—said to be the greatest reachorse of, his day). Castor was a great performer at all weights and distances, winning 22 races out of 28. starts. His descendants have only started their turicareer; yet their work was so good last season that he stands eighth in the winning sires' list, his 7 descendants having placed 1777 sovs to his credit. Castor's first gets have all shown ability on the Turf. His four-year-old son, Three Star, has the following record for his two-year-old running:—A.R.C. Summer: won Great Northern Foal Stakes, 6 furlongs, 8.10, in 1.19t, Nixie, 8.5, second, Doris, 8.5, third; second in Midsummer Handicap, 5 furlongs, 9.0, won by Nixie, 8.7. A.R.C. Autumn: won Northern Champagne Stakes, 6 furlongs, 9.3, Grenadier, 8.10, second, Anuversary, 8.8, third. The Castor—Veneration filly Ivy won the Wanganui J.C.'s Nursery Handicap, 5 furlongs, with 6.10, in 1.4, and at the Auckland Racing Club's Autumn Meeting she won the Onslow Stakes, 6 furlongs, with 6.10, in 1.4, and at the Auckland Racing Club's Autumn Meeting she won the Onslow Stakes, 6 furlongs, with 6.10, in 1.4, and at the Colt out of Bangle, Casket, finished second in the Marshall Memorial Stakes of 6 furlongs, at the D.J.C. Autumn Meeting, won by Forbury, and also ran a second with 8.10 in the Champagne Stakes, won by Bluefire, 8.8. Last season Bangle's son showed improvement, his work placing him fourth in the list of winning horses, with 1187 sovs against his name, Orion's Belt (from Bangle), one of Castor's two-year-old. Castor's Necklace filly, Collarette, ran second to Patroness at level weights in the A.J.C. Two-year-old Maiden Stakes, and on the third day of the meeting she beat Patroness and similar company to that which met her the first day, winning the 6 furlong Nursery Handicap in 1.164. Castor's list is full.

CUIRASSIER by Musket (imp.)—Frailty, by Goldsbrough—Flora McIvor, by New Warrior (imp.)—Io, by Sir Hercules. Cuirassier is full brother to that successful sire Trenton, who in his first season in Australia has sired Ronda (second in Melbourne Cup), Delaware, Etra-Weenie (winner of the Maribymong Plate and V.R.C. Oaks), Gaillardia, Lady Trenton, Light Artillery (one of the best two-year-olds of his season)—all good winners. Cuirassier himself ran second to Manton in the Hawkes Bay Guineas (beaten a head), and won the Great Northern Derby (beating Manton, Raglan, Hilda, etc., in the fast time of 2min 40)aec), the Great Northern St. Leger, Railway-Stakes Handicap, and Trial Stakes. ST. LEGER (imp.), by Doncaster (Derby winner) out of Atlantis, by Thormanby (Derby winner)—Hurricane (One Thousand winner), by Wild Dayrell (Derby winner). St. Leger was second on the list as winner-producing size for 1891-92, and was at the top of the tree for season 1892-93, with 14 winners of £5, 250 7e 6d. In view of the fact that his greatest son, St. Hippo, was not racing last season, and that he only had one two-year-old on the track, this record is a most meritorious one. Three of his descendants (Impulse, St. Cements, and Waiuku) slone took £2,490 9s. St. Leger is sire of St. Hippo, winner of the Hawke's Bay Guineas and Spring Handicap, New Kealand Cup in fastest time on record, Auckland Cup, Auckland Flate, and Great Northern Derby, and sire of other big winners, such as Clanranald, Hippomenes, St. Andrew, St. Clements, Impulse, Waiuku, Doris, Regel, Retaliation, St. Anthony, Marquis of Tawkesbury, Town Moor, St. Kilda, St. Patrick, Ben Godfrey. Terms: 30 guineas for single mares; 25 guineas two or more mares belonging to the same owner.

HOTCHKISS by Musket (imp.)—Petroleuse (imp.), by Oxford—Hartshorn, by Mountain Deer. This son of Musket produced Forma, the champion two-year-old of the North during last season, and True Blue, whose achievements in Australia stamp him as a racer from whom much may be expected. At the A.B.C. First Spring Meeting 1894-96 Forma won the September Stakes, 4 furiougs (winning in a canter) in 57sec, and at the Second Spring Meeting the Welcome Stakes, 5 furlongs, in 1.64. A.B.C. Burmer Meeting she won the Selvia Handicap, 6 furlongs, in 1.18, carrying 8.7. At the A.B.C. Autumn Meeting she won the Champagne Stakes, 6 furlongs, carrying 8.8, in 1.18, and the Ellerslie Handicap, carrying 9.8, in 1.18. In these races Forma "walked home." True Blue's two-year-old running shows he won Sydney Tattersall's Juvenile Stakes, 5 furlongs, in 1.22 (carrying 7.7), and the A.J.C. First Nursery Handicap, 6 furlongs, in 1.5 (carrying 8.5). He finished third in the Bathurst T.C. Sovereign Stakes, 1 mile (carrying 7.9); and in the Second Sovereign Stakes, at the same meeting, he finished second. Linstock did staunch two-year-old work last season, showing the possession of brilliant dash, and Virago's running was also of more than ordinary promise. Hotchkiss' half-afster Leonessa is dam of Westmere, who was well up in the list of inning two-year-olds. Terms: 20 guineas a mare; 15 guineas two or more.

Gipsy King is a bright bay, with black points, standing yer 16 hands t inch, symmetrically and powerfully built, and is a true type of the weight carrying throughbred borse, and may be more aptly described as a "tower of equine strength." His performances on the turf (vide appendix) at all distances and weights were of sterling merit, and proved him to be a first-class racehorse, and the fact that he ran into a place every time he started, with one exception, is sufficient proof that he was gifted with a great dash of pace, stamina, courseç, and a grand constitution. In all he started 16 times, his record being 7 firsts, 6 seconds, 2 thirds, and only once unplaced.

In placing Gipsy King at the service of breeders in the Hawers district probably for the last season the owners have every confidence in claiming that the horse has stood a thorough test as a stud horse, and the stock he has left—upstanding, strongly built, good looking horses, showing quality and substance—are a credit to so young a sire, and is an indication that he has the gift of transmitting his own goodness to his progeny. Like many other thorough bred stallions, Gipsy King has only served a limited number of well-bred mares, yet with these few chances he has produced several winners, and a number of his progeny now in training give every promise of distinguishing themselves this season.

Those of his stock that have run prominently are Dart, Bush Boy, The Hero, Vagrant, Storm King, Hesitation, Kaahu, and Steel King. The three former have won races both in New Zealand and Australia. At the Victoris Racing Club's National Meeting Dart ran second to Daimio—said to be the best steeplechase horse in the Australian colonies—in the V.R.C. Grand National Steeplechase of 1000 sovs, after which Dart was sold for 370 guineas and Bush Boy was passed in at 250 guineas. Last racing season Gipsy King's stock won in New Zealand £456, and Le Loup's stock won £978. Nearly all Gipsy King's progeny have a penchant for cross-country racing, and as this class of horse finds a ready salebreeders should study their own interests, and breed what they can sell.

Thoroughbred mares with or without foals will be taken the greatest care of, and all visiting mares will be placed in well grassed paddocks.
