HANDSOME JACK is by St. Leger (the well-known winner-producing sire), whose stock have won in New Zealand, since the season 1895-6, eighty-one races, valued at £21,672.

RADIANT, who never raced, is by that stoutly-bred sire Robinson Crusoe, whose mares are so highly thought of by Australian breeders, and as Radiant is from Radiance, this makes the dam of Handsome Jack full sister to those fast horses Quadrant and Cruiser (sire of the Rangitikei-bred Lorelei).

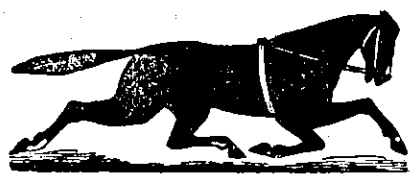
