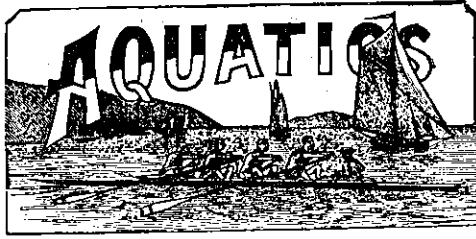


To meet this the athletic authority of the Sydney Referee ("Prodigal") suggests that the amateur athletic bodies should divide their ranks into two factions, the one to run for the trophy and honour and glory as at present, and the other for the cash consideration. The idea is a decidedly good one, though I fear it will meet with strenuous opposition in many quarters.

Some time ago we heard a good deal of a proposal to hold a Pan-Britannic Olympiad in England (the scheme emanating from Mr J. Astley Cooper), but of late the affair appeared to have passed out of sight. Apparently from the following article in the London Sporting Life adherents of Mr Cooper's idea are still at work. Says the writer:—"What are we going to do about celebrating the longest reign? This is a question which fairly concerns all sportsmen just now. In June next all our colonial premiers, together with other representatives of British blood from the uttermost parts of the earth, will assemble in London to do honour to our beloved Queen, and to celebrate her unparalleled reign. Every corner of the earth where the British flag flies will be represented. Advantage will be taken of this unique gathering to hold a great Pan-Britannic Conference, and discuss matters of Imperial interest. Now's our chance. Perhaps never again will sportsmen have such a glorious opportunity of discussing the International aspect of sport with their confreres from across the sea. Certainly not in our generation, at any rate. Now's the time, I say, to 'take opportunity by the head,' and see whether a Pan-Britannic sporting festival cannot be arranged upon the lines suggested by that keenest of sportsmen, Mr J. Astley Cooper. His idea is a grand one, and no longer is it looked upon as purely Utopian, impossible of consummation, as was the case years ago. That being so, the next thing is to consider the best means of formulating Mr Astley Cooper's idea, and rendering it workable. And when or where a more fitting time or place than the Pan-Britannic Conference in question? I know and appreciate how long and hard he has worked towards the desired end for the pure love of sport only. He has spent time and money freely already. But I sincerely hope that, now his reward is in sight, he will set about redoubled action right away."

The Canterbury Amateur Athletic Club held their autumn meeting on Saturday last, when H. De Maus won the three sprint events, viz., the 100yds (from 9yds) in 10sec, 200yds (from 17yds) in 20 2-5sec, 300yds (from 26yds) in 33sec, and also ran second in the 600yds. Quite a day out!



At a general meeting of the committee of the Auckland Annual Regatta, held last week, the secretary reported that the receipts amounted to a little over £309, out of which £217 had been paid away in prize money. Some accounts which had been outstanding for some years had also been wiped off, and there was a balance of over £6 in hand. Mr Nathan (chairman) expressed great pleasure at the efforts of the committee having been so successful, and moved a cordial vote of thanks to Mr C. C. Dacre, for the energetic manner in which he had worked to make the regatta a success. The motion was unanimously carried, and Mr Dacre in returning thanks, asserted that it only required a little combined action on the part of the committee to raise all the funds needed to carry the regatta to a successful issue.

On April 7 the final contest for the sculling handicap in connection with the Auckland Rowing Club took place, and resulted in a splendid race between Baker, Dean, and A. W. Paterson. After an exciting finish, Baker won by about two feet from Dean, with Paterson very close up.

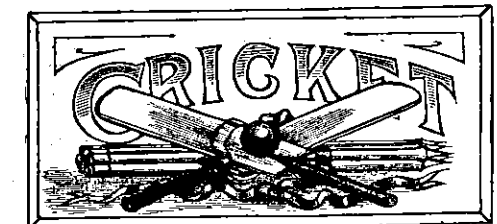

New South Wales is the premier colony in Australian cricket this season, and for the second year in succession the mother colony is the holder of Lord Sheffield's beautiful shield. The senior electorate matches have been a great success, and although they have not yet been completed it is pretty certain that last year's winners, the Glebe, will be again at the top of the tree. This is the team with which M'Kibbin and Coningham play, and the Sydney Mail reports that the Glebe are about to suffer a severe loss, as T. Cobcroft, G. Youill, and J. Doyle have made up their minds to go to New Zealand. The first-named is pretty well-known in New Zealand, as he captained the last New South Wales team which visited us. For two years he has captained the victorious Glebe team. He is a steady, reliable batsman, a good field anywhere, and an excellent change bowler. In the last match with Glebe he made 50. Youill is an Inter-colonial player of no mean repute. He is a most elegant batsman, and is no stranger to the centuries, while he is a fair field and occasionally bowls. Jimmy Doyle is well-known in Sydney sporting circles. He is not as good a cricketer as his two companions, but in racing law he is proficient, and all horsemen will remember him as one of Mr T. S. Clibborn's most active assistants in the Australian Jockey Club's office.
