HACK RACE MEETING

TO BE HELD ON THE YORK FARM RACECOURSE ON WEDNESDAY AND THURSDAY, 8TH AND 9TH SEPTEMBER.

PROGRAMME.

FIRST DAY.

Hunters' Hurdles, a handicap for hunters only, of 25 sovs; second horse to receive 2 sovs from the stakes. About one mile and a half. Nomination, 10s; acceptance, 15s. Minimum weight, 10st.—To start at 12 noon.

Flying Handicap of 30 sovs; second horse to receive 5 sovs from the stakes. Distance, six furlongs. Nomination, 10s; acceptance, 15s.—To start at 12.45 p.m.

The Bangitikei Hunt Club Cup, a steeplechase for hunters only, of 40 sovs; second horse to receive 5 sovs from the stakes. About three miles. Minimum weight, 11st. Nomination, 1 sov; acceptance, 1sov. Gentlemen-riders; professional riders to carry 7lb extra.—To start at 1.45 p.m.

Maiden Flat Race of 25 sovs; second horse to receive 2 sovs from the stakes. About one mile. Weight for age. Entrance, 1 sov.—To start at 2.30 p.m.

Handicap Hurdle Race of 25 sovs; second horse to receive 2 sovs from the stakes. About one mile and a half. Nomination, 10s; acceptance, 15s.—To start at 3.15 p.m.

Trial Handicap Steeplechase of 25 sovs, for horses that have never won a steeplechase; second horse to receive 2 sovs from the stakes. About two miles. Nomination, 10s; acceptance, 15s.—To start at 4 p.m.

Upper Tutaenui Stakes of 25 sovs; second horse to receive 2 sovs from the stakes. A welter handicap. About one mile and a distance. Nomination, 10s; acceptance, 15s. Winner of Flying to carry a penalty of 7lbs.—To start at 4.45 p.m.

SECOND DAY.

Trial Handicap Hurdles of 25 sovs; second horse to receive 2 sovs from the stakes. For horses that have never won a hurdle race. About one mile and a half. Nomination, 10s; acceptance, 15s.—To start at 12 noon.

Electric Handicap of 25 sovs; second horse to receive 2 sovs from the stakes. Five furlongs. Nomination, 10s; acceptance, 15s.—To start at 12.45 p.m.

Ladies' Bracelet. A Handicap Steeplechase of 20 sovs. For hunters only; nominated by ladies. Gentlemen-riders; minimum weight, 11st; professional riders to carry 7lbs extra. About two miles.—To start at 1.30 p.m.

York Farm Handicap of 40 sovs; second horse to receive 5 sovs from the stakes. One mile and a quarter. Nomination, 1 sov; acceptance, 1 sov. Winner of Electric to carry a penalty of 7lb.—To start at 2.15 p.m.

Second Handicap Hurdles of 25 sovs; second horse to receive 2 sovs from the stakes. About one mile and a half. Winner of Trial to carry a penalty of 7lbs. Nomination, 10s; acceptance, 15s.—To start at 3.15 p.m.

Hack Handicap Steeplechase of 25 sovs; second horse to receive 2 sovs from the stakes. About two miles. Nomination, 10s; acceptance, 15s.—To start at 4 p.m.

Welter Final Handicap of 20 sovs. About seven furlongs. Nomination, 10s; acceptance, 10s.—To start at 4.45 p.m.

NOMINATIONS, WEIGHTS, ACCEPTANCES, AND GENERAL ENTRIES.

NOMINATIONS will close at the Secretary's Office, Marton, on SATURDAY, August 21st, at 8 p.m. WEIGHTS will be declared on or about the 28th inst. ACCEPTANCES and GENERAL ENTRIES on SATURDAY, 4th September, at 9.30 p.m. WEIGHTS for Second Day's Races will be declared on the evening of WEDNESDAY, 8th September, at 8.30; ACCEPTANCE the same evening at 9.30.

RULES.

1. Horses qualified to run at this meeting are those which have never won a race of over £40, hack and hunter races excepted.

2. A Hunter means a hack whose owner can produce at its scales a certificate from the Master of any Hunt Club that the horse has been ridden to hounds during the past season to the satisfaction of the Master, and has not won a race of over £40, hack and hunter races excepted.

The Rules of Racing, as adopted by the metropolitan Jockey Club of New Zealand, are adhered to.

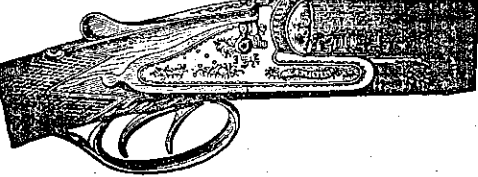
