

DEFINITION OF A HACK.—A hack is a horse that has never won an advertised race (hack and hunter races ex-cepted), and that is not, at the time of entry, nominated for any race (hack and hunter races excepted), nor has won a race of the value of 80 soys, or races of the collective value of 150 soys, since 1st August; 1889.
