



AUCKLAND RACING CLUB. SPRING MEETING.

FIRST DAY.—SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 8, 1890.

PRESIDENT'S HANDICAP of 60 sovs; second horse to receive 10 sovs. out of the stakes. For three-year-olds and upwards. Entrance 1 sov., and acceptance 1 sov. each, to go to the funds. One mile.
