 Auckland. He is seven years old.

 Produce Stakes, in which he beat Howitzer, Ricochet, Tamora,
 Lady Norah, and others. In the Flying Stakes he beat
 Mitrailleuse and four others (he ran the 2-mile in 1m. 17s.). Won
 the Ellerslie Plate beating Tamora and Antelope.

 season 1881 headed the list of winners with a total of £1,455.
