

humor for trifling. He spurred backwards and forwards with a vicious, business-like look, but Burke's face was wreathed in smiles, and when Pritchard let fly out of distance the "Irish lad" winked in a knowing manner at his friends. Burke displayed marked cleverness in the first round, and easily avoided Pritchard's rushes. The latter did not relish this, and in some rattling exchanges "the fur flew," or, in other words, the stuffing from the gloves. During the minute's rest the referee entered the ring and addressed both men, but what he said did not transpire, and amid considerable excitement the pair again took the centre. Burke was still all gaiety, and he now thoroughly roused Pritchard with two rare left-handers on the chin. Ted's blood was up with a vengeance, and, rushing in, some give-and-take work ensued, the noise being so deafening that the men altogether failed to hear the voice of the watch-holder, and fought for some seconds beyond time. Just towards the close Burke slipped to the floor, and loud cries of "two ponies Pritchard" were heard during the minute's rest. So far Burke had none the worst of the business, and few were prepared for the speedy termination which followed. After boxing a minute in the third round Burke came to the floor from a half-arm hit on the point. Here he lay a few seconds, and then, springing to his feet, he dashed into close quarters. Twice again he came to the boards, and though he rolled over three or four times on the last occasion, he failed to rise in the necessary ten seconds, and the referee consequently, amid a scene of the wildest excitement, announced Pritchard as the winner. So ended the latest big fight. Little more remains to be said. Burke's form, providing it was his best form, proved terribly disappointing; and, judging by his show of last night, he has deteriorated rather than improved. Thinking the matter over, one can hardly believe him to be the same man who stood up five rounds against Sullivan when the latter was Sullivan, or to be the man who fought such a game eight-round draw as he did against Frank Slavin, to say nothing of his shows with other good men in the colonies and America. Nothing was wrong in his condition, which all his friends voted perfect; therefore we must assume that Burke has had his day and gone off altogether. As to Pritchard, he has again failed to find a man to stand any length of time against him. Though nothing like so tricky as Burke, his blows have all the sting of the latter's, and Ted yet remains an unbeaten—in fact, one might say an unextended—man. Pritchard now intends visiting America, and a meeting between the victorious Englishman and Bob Fitzsimmons will be anxiously looked forward to.
