EASTER MONDAY, APRIL 18, 1892.

PROGRAMME.

TRADESMEN'S PLATE HANDICAP of 80 sovs. Second horse to receive 10 sovs. out of the stakes. Entrance 1 sov., and acceptance 1 sov. each to go the funds. For three-year-olds and upwards. One mile.

NORTHERN CHAMPAGNE STAKES of 200 sovs., added to a sweepstakes of 10 sovs. each; 5 sovs. forfeit, or no liability if declared by 8 p.m. on the night of general entry. The second horse to receive 30 sovs. and third horse 10 sovs. from the stakes. For two-year-olds. Colts, 8st 10lbs; fillies, 8st 8lbs; geldings allowed 5lbs. The forfeit (5 sovs.) to be declared and paid to the A.R.C. Secretary by 12 noon on the day before the race, or the nominator will be liable for the whole stakes. The winner of the Auckland or Canterbury Welcome Stakes, or the Great Northern Foal Stakes, or any race not a handicap, of the advertised value of 200 sovs., to carry 7lbs extra. Closed 41 subscribers. Six furlongs.

EASTER HANDICAP of 300 sovs., added to a sweepstakes of 5 sovs. each. Second horse to receive 50 sovs. and third horse 15 sovs. out of the stakes. For three-year-olds and upwards. Entrance 2 sovs., and acceptance 2 sovs. each, to go to the funds. The winner of any race of the value of 100 sovs., after the declaration of the weights, to carry 3lbs extra; of 200 sovs, 5lbs; of 100 sovs., and one of 200 sovs., 7lbs, extreme penalty. One mile and a half.

HURDLE RACE (Handicap) of 100 sovs. Second horse to receive 10 sovs. out of the stakes. Entrance 1 sov., and acceptance 1 sov. each, to go to the funds. Two miles.

SELLING RACE of 50 sovs. For three-year-olds and upwards. Entrance 2 sovs. each, to go to the funds. Three-year-olds to carry 9st 9lbs; four-year-olds, 10st 3lbs; five-year-olds and upwards, 10st 5lbs. The winner to be sold by auction immediately after the race for 150 sovs., and the whole of the surplus to go to the funds. If entered to be sold for 100 sovs., allowed 7lbs; if for 75 sovs., 14lbs; if for 50 sovs., 21lbs; if for 25 sovs., 28lbs; if for nil, 42lbs. Six furlongs.

EDEN HANDICAP of 100 sovs. Second horse to receive 10 sovs. out of the stakes. For three-year-olds and upwards. Entrance 1 sov., and acceptance 1 sov. each, to go to the funds. Winner of any handicap after the declaration of the weights to carry 5lbs extra. Seven furlongs.

ONSLow STAKES (Handicap) of 80 sovs. Second horse to receive 10 sovs. out of the stakes. For two-year-olds that have never won a race of the value of 100 sovs. at time of entry. Winner of Champagne Stakes to carry a penalty of 10lbs. Entrance 1 sov., and acceptance 1 sov. each, to go to the funds. Six furlongs.

THE STEWARDS' HANDICAP of 80 sovs. Second horse to receive 10 sovs. out of the stakes. For three-year-olds and upwards. Entrance 1 sov., and acceptance 1 sov. each, to go to the funds. One mile.

ELLERSLIE HANDICAP of 100 sovs. Second horse to receive 10 sovs. out of the stakes. For two-year-olds. Entrance 1 sov., and acceptance 2 sovs. each, to go to the funds. Six furlongs.

AUTUMN HANDICAP of 250 sovs., added to a sweepstakes of 3 sovs. each. Second horse to receive 30 sovs. and third horse 10 sovs. out of the stakes. For three-year-olds and upwards. Entrance 2 sovs., and acceptance 3 sovs. each, to go to the funds. One mile and a quarter.

AUTUMN STEEPLECHASE (Handicap) of 200 sovs., added to a sweepstakes of 3 sovs. each. Second horse to receive 30 sovs. and third horse 15 sovs. out of the stakes. Entrance 2 sovs., and acceptance 2 sovs. each, to go to the funds. About three miles and a half.

FLYING STAKES of 60 sovs. Second horse to receive 10 sovs. out of the stakes. For two-year-olds and upwards. Entrance 2 sovs. each, to go to the funds. Two-year-olds to carry 7st 4lbs; three-year-olds, 8st 9lbs; four-year-olds and upwards, 9st. Winner since 1st August, 1891, of a weight-for-age race of the value of 50 sovs. to carry 5lbs extra; of 100 sovs., 7lbs extra; of 200 sovs., 10lbs extra; or of such races collectively of the value of 300 sovs., 14lbs extra. Three-quarters of a mile.

WELTER HANDICAP of 50 sovs. Second horse to receive 5 sovs. out of the stakes. For three-year-olds and upwards. Minimum weight 7st 5lbs. Entrance 1 sov., and acceptance 1 sov. each, to go to the funds. One mile.

SHORTS HANDICAP of 100 sovs. Second horse to receive 15 sovs. from the stakes. For two-year-olds and upwards. Entrance 1 sov., and acceptance 1 sov. each, to go to the funds. The winner of any race after the publication of the weights to carry 5lbs penalty. Six furlongs.

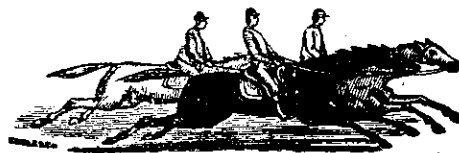
