12.30 p.m.—OCTOBER HANDICAP of 60 sovs.; second horse to receive 10 sovs. from the stake. Nomination, 1 sov.; acceptance, 1 sov. 1 mile and a distance.

1.15 p.m.—HANDICAP HURDLE RACE of 100 sovs.; second horse to receive 15 sovs. and third horse 5 sovs. from the stake. Nomination, 1 sov.; acceptance, 2 sovs. About 2 miles.

2.15 p.m.—HAWKE'S BAY GUINEAS of 250 sovs.; with a sweepstake of 10 sovs. for acceptors added; second horse to receive 30 sovs. from the stake. For three-year-olds. Colts, 8st 10lb; fillies and geldings, 8st 5lb. Sweep on night of general entry. Closed with 96 nominations. 1 mile.

3 p.m.—MAIDEN PLATE of 50 SOVS.; second horse to receive 10 sovs. from the stake. For three-year-olds and upwards that have never won a race exceeding 25 sovs. in value at time of entry; winner of any such race after entry to carry 7lb extra. Weights—Three-year-olds, 7st 7lb; four-year-olds and upwards, 8st 2lb; mares allowed 5lb, geldings 3lb. Entrance, 1 sov. 1 1/2 miles.

3.45 p.m.—WELCOME STAKES of 100 sovs.; second horse to receive 10 sovs. from the stake. For two-year-olds. Weights—Colts, 8st 5lb; fillies and geldings, 8st. Entrance, 2 sovs. 4 furlongs.

4.30 p.m.—CORINTHIAN STAKES, a handicap of 40 sovs. Minimum weight, 10st. Gentlemen riders. Nomination, 1 sov.; acceptance, nil. 1 1/2 miles. N.B.—Applications for election as a gentleman rider must be made to the committee of the Jockey Club in whose district the applicant resides, and must be proposed and seconded by members of the Club. On election the committee shall issue a certificate, which shall entitle the holder to ride as a gentleman rider on any racecourse where these rules are in force, provided that the certificate may be cancelled at any time on sufficient cause being shown. No person having received payment in consideration of work performed in connection with the training or riding of horses shall be eligible to ride as a gentleman rider.

1. OPEN HURDLES of 30 sovs.; distance, about 1 1/2 mile. Nomination, 10s.; Acceptance, £1. To start at 11 a.m.

2. HANDICAP HACK HURDLES of 20 sovs.; distance, about 1 1/2 mile. Nomination, 10s.; Acceptance, 10s. To start at noon.

3. RANGITIKEI HUNT CUP, a handicap Steeplechase, value 10 sovs.; distance, about 3 miles. Nomination, 5s.; Acceptance, 5s. For qualified hunters only. (See Rules). Other than gentlemen riders carry 7lb. extra. Minimum weight, 11st. 7lb. To start at 1 p.m.

4. FLYING HANDICAP FLAT RACE of 100 sovs.; second horse to receive 5 sovs. out of the stakes. Distance, about 3/4 of a mile. Nomination, 10s.; Acceptance, 10s. To start at 1.45 p.m.

5. OPEN HANDICAP STEEPLECHASE of 60 sovs.; second horse to receive 10 sovs. out of the stakes. Distance, about 3 miles. Nomination, 1 sov.; Acceptance, 2 sovs. To start at 2.30 p.m.

6. LADIES' BRACELET, value 10 sovs.; handicap Steeplechase for qualified hunters nominated by ladies. Distance, about 2 miles. Handicaps to be declared after Cup race; acceptance before Open Steeplechase. Nomination, 5s.; Acceptance, 5s. Same conditions as Cup. To start at 3.15 p.m.

7. HACK HANDICAP FLAT RACE of 20 sovs. Distance, about 1 1/2 mile. Nomination, 10s.; Acceptance, 10s. To start at 4 p.m.

8. MEMBERS' STEEPLECHASE, a Cup presented by Mr. S. Gibbons, value 10 sovs. For qualified hunters, property of members of the Rangitikei Hunt Club, that have never won a race of any kind (other than point to point steeplechase). Distance about 2 miles. Minimum weight, 13st. To be ridden by amateur riders who have regularly hunted this season with the Rangitikei hounds.

RULES.

1. All races to be run under the Rules of Racing as adopted by the Metropolitan Clubs in New Zealand.

2. All races, with the exception of Nos. 1 and 6, are open to hacks only. Definition of Hacks as adopted by W.J.C. strictly adhered to.

3. A Hunter is a horse that has hunted with the Rangitikei Hounds, or any other recognised pack of hounds, to the satisfaction of the Master for season 1892, and must be the bona fide property of a member of a Club.

4. In races 3, 6, and 8, Master's Certificate must be produced to the Clerk of the Scales, or the horses will not be allowed to start.

5. All Nominations, Entries, Acceptances, &c., accompanied by the necessary amounts payable, must be in the hands of the Secretary not later than 9 p.m. on the dates named.

6. All Nominations must contain description, pedigree, performances, and necessary fees. Colours with stances and general entries.

Again Mr wick looks properly chagrined cutting Sir Geoffrey's billiard
