

In races 3, 6, and 8, Master's Certificate must-be produced to the Clerk of the Scales, or the horses will not be allowed to start. 5. All Nominations, Entries, Acceptances, &c., accom-panied by the necessary amounts payable, must be in the hands of the Secretary not later than 9 p.m. on the dates named.


