### ANSWERS TO CORRESPONDENTS.

DOUBT,' Wanganui. — The C.J.C. have determined that the rule affecting trainers' licenses adopted by the Conference means that owners adopted by the Conference means that owners training horses absolutely their own are not required to register, and have passed a resolution to that effect. Mr Percival, the secretary of the A.R.C., informs us that his club has arrived at a similar decision. The A.R.C. secretary further states that such owners are entitled to admission to all Metropolitan courses. Clubs other than Metropolitan, however, may refuse admission.

# Sporting Review.

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 12, 1893.

THE action of the Wairarapa Trotting Club in disqualifying Mr Hiley, the owner of Tinker, for life for his acts in connection with the last race meeting of the club should have a chastening effect upon racehorse owners who feel inclined to leave the straight track for the tortuous one of turf trickery. Mr Hiley, it appears, ran his gelding in the harness race under the name of Dick, and won the race. But the owner of Fragment, a mare engaged in the same race, lodged an objection and proved to the satisfaction of the stewards that the winner had raced under an alias. Then Mr Hiley took up the position that he had been deceived by the previous owner of the gelding, and solemnly declared that when he purchased Tinker he was not aware that the horse had raced before. The stewards, who must be possessors of unusually trusting natures, accepted the statement, and believing Mr Hiley to be an injured innocent, awarded the race to the second horse, but softened the blow by passing a formal resolution that 'the stewards wish to express their appreciation of the straightforward manner in which Mr Hiley, the present owner of the horse Dick, had given his evidence, and had thus cleared the matter up at once.' But, alas for the trusting stewards and the guileless Mr Hiley. The former owner of Tinker read the resolution in the daily papers, and promptly forwarded evidence through the New Zealand Trotting Association, which conclusively proved that Mr Hiley when buying the gelding was told his name was Tinker, and that he had won two races. Then the stewards in the fulness of their wrath rescinded their resolution, and altered the verdict of honourable acquittal of Mr Hiley to disqualification for life. But how they will curse penning that resolution.

AT last the Carrie case has been settled after long and careful consideration on the part of the Auckland Coursing Club. The decision the club has come to is that Mr Blaikie's representative Kotero shall get the full amount of the second prize, and that each of the five dogs that were beaten by Carrie shall divide the first prize. Under the rules the committee of the club had no option but to divide the money equally among the dogs Carrie met, but the second half of the rule dealing with the matter opens up the question whether the rule should not be altered. Rule 29, after providing for the division of the money amongst the dogs beaten by the disqualified contestant says: - . . . and if a piece of plate or prize has been added and won by him, only the dogs which he beat in the several rounds shall have a right to contend for it.' And it is in the last four words that we feel inclined to see a better way of settling the matter than by dividing the stake. Why not let the five dogs which were beaten by Carrie run off for

be fairer we think than the process of cutting up provided for by the present rule. One of those five dogs may have been inferior to Carrie and yet slightly superior to the remaining four, and in such a case it would surely be fairer to the owner to run the match off again. It would certainly be more to the taste of backers. The Coursing Club has decided that wagers shall follow the division of the stakes, so the backers of Kotero, Melos, Rifleman, Comet and Rockbail will receive a fifth part of their wagers.

THE Hawke's Bay Jockey Club have determined to make bookmakers 'sit up' if they persist in wagering on their course. The club has inserted an advertisement in the local papers in connection with their Spring Meeting which reads: 'Any bookmaker laying wagers within the grounds used for this race meeting will be ordered to leave the grounds. In the event of his refusal he will be removed therefrom, and, if necessary, prosecuted. Any person who, having been evicted, re-enters, will be prosecuted for malicious trespass. This is warm—very warm. Had the club cautioned the books against laying 'tote' odds no one would venture to question their action, but to prevent the opening of a book under any circumstances is rather severe. But pro-bably the pencillers have only themselves to blame. Had they taken to heart the warnings delivered in the past by the club respecting 'tote' odds the present sweeping act would probably never have taken place. But we think it would be fairer if the club followed the example of the Auckland Racing Club and licensed the metallicians. If they persisted in offering machine odds they could then be removed,' 'evicted,' &c., according to the terms of the club's manifesto.

THE 'tote' men are having a hard time of it in Sydney at present; hardly a day passing without someone being fined by the N.S.W. magistrates. Writing on the subject in the Referee 'Verax' (Nat. Gould) says:—'Last week John Croft was brought before Mr G. H. Smithers, D.S.M., at the Water Police Court, for having, in plain, not legal phraseology, run a tote. Mr E. Wallace, who defended, argued—

(1) That the evidence for the prosecution showed that the office mentioned in the information was the office of J. Barkell, and that the detion was the office of J. Barkell, and that the defendant was merely a servant of his; (2) that the subscription of money by a number of persons into a common fund or stake (with the agreement among themselves that their money should be held by an individual as a stakeholder, and handed over to such of the subscribers who would select the first, second, or third horses in the race) was not a receiving of money by such stakeholder as a consideration or a promise to give thereafter certain money on the contingency of such race, as stated in the section of the Act; (3) that there stated in the section of the Act; (3) that there was no evidence of such promise, undertaking, or agreement on the part of the defendant in that

Mr Smithers considered the case proved, and fined defendant £20, with £5 5s costs. An appeal, we hear, is to be made, and Mr Wallace's arguments are certainly to the point. If his arguments hold good, "tote" promoters will find very little difficulty in carrying on their operations in future. It will be interesting to see what the result of such an appeal is if it be made.' It is evident the 'tote' men are going to fight hard for existence, but they will have a hard task in Sydney, where the feeling is very strong against workers of the machine.

# Coming Events.

THE CAULFIELD CUP.

SATURDAY next will see the opening of the Victoria Amateur Turf Club's Spring race meeting, and as the following Saturday, October 21st, is the day for the Caulfield Cup gallop, I will give a few remarks respecting the chances of the various candidates. Since the weights came out the top impost has come down from 9.13 to 9.5. Cremorne stood at the previous figure, but since then the name has dropped out in favour of the Melbourne Cup, and Fortunatus now heads the list at 9.5. Sternchaser stands at the same figure, and of the two candidates I prefer the former's chance, thinking as I do that Sternchaser is meant for the V.R.C. big event.
