NERINGLA is nineteen years old and has missed to the horse for several years. She has this year been put to Eton, and with the aid of the Cerles impregnator is believed to have held. Being by Coldsbrough from Mabel, by imported Millionaire—Varroville she belongs to the No. 4 family, and a foal from her should be valuable.


OUR LADY is a dark brown or black mare by Simmer-Lady Agnes, by Nec-kersgat-Peradventure (imp.), by Adven-



ETONA, by Castor-Lady Walmsley (sister to Carbine), is a beautifully bred young mare, foaled 1898, and has a very fine colt foal at foot by imported Cyren-

ian and has been served by Soult.

GWENDOLINE (1897) is another very fine young mare and the dam of Gweniad, who is undoubtedly possessed of great pace. Ev Soult—The Shelah, a daughter of Eiffern Allanah, by Musket Roselin Gwandoline, bus, great blood -Rosalie, Gwendoline has great blood for a brood mare and has visited Fton.

PTT-A-PAT (1890), by Rubert--Foot-print, by Robinson Crusoe-Balkis, by Chieftain, is a very handsome bay mare and is served by Eton. KILMOREY (imp.), 1892, is one of the choice lots of the stud; a whole black

showing great quality, and with a sweet temper, she would be desirable in in any stud. She is the dam of Newry. Armagh, Little Mahel, Kilmarnock, and Kilderkin, all wieners. She missed last year to Eton and has visited him again. Bred at the Yardley Stud, England, she is by Kilwarlin from Union, by Sterling, and her pedigree is full of classic winners.

LADY AGNES (1886) is another rare bred one, heing by Neckersgat (sire of Dunlop, etc.,) from Peradventure (imp.), by Adventurer (sire of Pretender) from Girmann (1000 onineas), by Bird-Manganese (1000 guineas), by Bird-catcher. She has a filly at foot by Eton and has visited him again.

WINDMILL (1886), by Goldsbrough-Merry-go Round, by Hamlet-Whirly ool (half-sister to that great mare Hurricane), has made her reputation by the performances of her daughter Air Motor, one of Australia's best performers; also her son Spalpeen, a great horse over hurdles. This mare missed to Eton last year and has this year been mated with

RATTIER (1898) a full sister to Seahorse, the best three-year-old of his year in New Zealand, a fine big mare with a nice colt foal by Cyrcnian, and served by Soult. Peing by Nelson out of the Goldskorough mare Moenga she is a rare bred one and should receive at cution next Wednesday.

SONGSTRESS I hear has died since my visit. She was an old mare and has produced many useful recehorses in Australia. Her daughter Canatatrice was sold last year at Messrs Nathan's sole for 300 guineas. Songstress left a filly foal by Cyrenian, which I presume will be sold.

DOLLY, the dam of Solo and the champion pony Sonica, is by Randwick from a Young Plover mare, and has served by Eton.

The mares all appear to be robust and bookthy. Indeed, with numerous b autifolly grassed peddocks and plenty of cheds and live shelter they could hardly fail to do justice to the care and attentionthey receive.

The stallien Pton, by Castor-I ady Walmsley, by Musket-Mersey, was running in his paddock and was getting plenty of exercise by galloping about. He was hardly in show condition, but hard and healthy looking.
