WELLINGTON.

WELLINGTON, August 22. The Grand National, meeting was the subject of considerable interest in local sporting circles. Although Weblington was not represented in the G.N. Steeplechase, our solitary representative, Hydrant, made a bold bid for the G.N. Hurdle Race, and the locally-owned and bred gelding, Aborization ginal, captured that valuable prize, the Winter Cup. Hydrant probably would have been all the better had he been given a run on the first day of the meeting in the Jumper's Flat Race, but Cuiragno defeated him so easily at the finish that there is no doubt the better horse won.

Aboriginal was undoubtedly on recent form most leniently treated in being awarded the minimum impost in the Cup, and on the appearance of the weights he was selected to defeat the whole of the horses placed on the mark with him. Many good judges of racing went further, and declared that nothing below 10st, had a chance with the son of Merriwee. Aboriginal more than justified the opinion form-Aboriginal ed of his abilities by winning the Winter Cup from end to end, and no horse got near enough to him to test his staying powers. Mr. W. Donald, owner and breeder of Aboriginal, was warmly congratulated on his colt's victory.

The representatives of the Porirua stable failed to run into a place in each of their efforts. Gold Crown and Maui were started in the Winter Cup, and were early beaten, finishing some distance away. Their trainer apparently did not consider that sufficient poundage was allowed for their defeats, as the pair were not again saddled up. Ailsa's owner decided to give her a run on the second day in the August Handicap, and she was the last to pass the winning post. With an allowance of a couple of pounds she was again beaten out of place in the Selwyn Handicap on the concluding day of the meeting. Ailsa's owner, "Mr. Brett," of Dune-din, considers his mare much overrated by handicappers, and has decided to send her to the stud.

W. Davies, the Hutt trainer, was expected to capture a race with his pair of four-year-olds, Armamento and Landwern. The veteran's represen-tatives were each allotted the minimum impost for the two flat handicaps on the last day of the meeting, and Davies just missed winning the Landwern easily annexed the Heathcote Handicap, whilst Armamento suffered a narrow defeat in the Selwyn Handicap from that good sprinter Red Gauntlet. The Wellington owner-trainer has a useful pair of young horses, and all going well some nice stakes should fall to them in the near future.

Although the C.J.C. offered good stakes for the concluding day's racing, quite a number of North Island horses dropped out of their third day's engagements. Stewart Waddel, Alick Hall, T. Quinlivan, J. Prosser, W. Donald, and J. O'Driscoll controlled in all fifteen horses, not one of which was saddled up on the third day. Kremlin, Shrapnel, Black Reynard, Aboriginal, Gold Crown, Maui, Gazeley and Sol, although extensively engaged, were each only saddled up The fields once during the meeting. nevertheless were fairly good and the racing interesting right through the

Messrs. J. B. Harcourt (president), A. E. Whyte (secretary), and J. H. Pollock (handicapper) represented the W.R.C. at the Grand National Meeting. Several of the club's stewards who usually patronise the C.J.C. winter function were unable to tend owing to business engagements.

Of the Winter Cup contestants claiming New Zealand Cup engagements, none displayed form to warrant their being selected as likely Lyrist New Zealand Cup winners. and Landwern certainly displayed fair form in the minor events, but Blythemaid, Bulawayo, Makaroff, Notus, Tirole, Tsitsihar, Welbeck and Balsam performed so indifferently that their prospects are nil so far as winning the New Zealand Cup is concerned.
