4. TAYFORTH HACK HURDLE RACE HANDICAP of 100sovs; second horse to receive 15sovs, and third horse 5sovs from the stake. Nomination, 1sov; acceptance, 1sov. About one mile and three-quarters, over seven flights of hurdles 3ft 6in in height.
 5. WANGANUI CUP HANDICAP of 650 sovs; second horse to receive 75sovs and third horse 25sovs from the stake. In the event of any ent ant winning a handicap of the value of 100sovs after the declaration of weights the handicapper will review that horse's weight, and will raise it or allow it to stand as he thinks fit.
