The committee is pledged to close three hotels, and to refuse accommodation licenses at race meetings, cattle sales, etc.

The Commercial Hotel at Waverley was gutted by fire on Tuesday night, and the Clarendon Hotel was partially destroyed. The fire originated in the kitchen of the Commercial Hotel. This building was owned by Mr. Ellis, and occupied by Mr. Smith, the latter being a heavy loser. The hotels were on opposite sides of the street, and the fire brigade had great difficulty in preventing the spread of the flames. The damage at the Clarendon, occupied by Mr. Oakenfall, is estimated at several hundreds of pounds. The insurances on the Commercial are: Building, £900; stock, £300; furniture, £700. The Clarendon building was insured for £1025, and the furniture and stock for £875. The inmates of the Commercial lost nearly all of their belongings, escaping in their night clothes.

Consequent upon an intimation by the police that they intended to oppose all applications by the licensed victuallers of Newmarket, England, for the extension of an hour for the licensed houses during all the ensuing race weeks, excepting those of the July Meeting, the licensed victuallers were legally represented before the justices. Considerable evidence was called in favour of the extension, while the police contended that the principal license-holders did not wish for it, and many towns-people objected on the ground that those using the licensed premises were frequently noisy when proceeding home after midnight; and, furthermore, that it necessitated extra police duty. The justices, after a short retirement, decided to grant the extension as usual.




