- Lot 1—CHESTNUT FILLY, by Hotchkiss, from Ganzu, by (imp) Castor from Gannet, by (imp) Anteros, from Albatross, by Malta. This cross on a Castor mare show great promise.
Lot 2—BROWN FILLY, by St Leger (imp) from Eve, by Brigadier, from The Jilt, by Traducer. This is a splendid combination.
Lot 3—BROWN COLT, by Hotchkiss out of Onida, by Yattendon, the dam of Artillery, Hilda, Strathmore, Brown Alice and Hazel; all good winners.
Lot 4—CHESTNUT COLT, by Castor (imp) dam Lady Wellington. The dam of this colt is own sister to Derringer.
Lot 5—GREY COLT, by Seaton Delaval (imp) dam Vivandiere, by Musket. Dam of the winners Three Star, The Dancer, Tauhei, Gallant, Daytree and Son-of-a-Gun.
Lot 6—BAY FILLY, by Castor (imp) dam Gissy, by Musket, The dam of Day Star, Altair, Circe; all high-class winners, and that promising colt Sant Lario.
Lot 7—CHESTNUT COLT, by Castor (imp) dam Bangle, by Musket, the dam of Casket, Orion's Belt, Ringlet, Casket, winner of Dunedin Cup 500 sovs, President's Handicap 150 sovs, C.J.C. Great Easter Handicap 500 sovs.
Lot 8—BAY COLT, by Hotchkiss, dam St Evelyn by St Leger (imp) out of Lady Evelyn, dam of many winners. This colt is a splendid specimen of the thoroughbred containing the best strains of running blood direct from the great English Formosa.
Lot 9—DARK CHESTNUT COLT, by Hotchkiss, dam Lady Augusta, by St Leger (imp) out of Brown Alice, own sister to Strathmore, a combination of Musket and St Leger blood not to be surpassed.
Lot 10—CHESTNUT COLT, by Hotchkiss, dam Valentinia, by Leolinus (son of Yattendon) from Lyre (imp) by Thormanby from Clotilda, by Touchstone. This is a well-grown colt, containing Musket and Stockwell combinations.
Lot 11—BAY COLT, by Muskapeer (son of Musket) dam Young Polish, by Feve (imp). This is a well grown and shapely colt, bred on same lines as that good performer Lottie, who won many races at Ellerslie.
Lot 12—CHESTNUT FILLY, by St Jack, son of St Leger, out of Balista by Musket, dam Jeannie, by Nordenfeldt out of Victoria by Feve (imp).
Lot 13—BROWN FILLY, by St Leger (imp) dam Forme by Nordenfeldt out of Formo, by Stirlingworth (imp) out of imp. Pulchra, by Resuscitant out of the great English Formosa. Forme the dam of this filly was great performer at all weights and distances, and is the dam of Formosan, the winner of the North Island Challenge Stakes, beating Advance, also of Cruciform, a promising filly. Her grandmother, Formo, is the dam of Forma, Multiforum and Uniform, all brilliant performers.
Lot 14—CHESTNUT COLT, by Castor (imp), dam Lady Peer by Muskapeer, son of Musket, out of Miss Brunette, by Cap-a-pier from Beauty, by Ravensworth from Brunette by Ratan (imp).
Lot 15—BROWN COLT, by Muskapeer, dam Bay Bess, by St Leger out of Cantiniere, by Musket. Bay Bess is own sister to that good performer Woodstock. Brown Bess, was a winner of five races in New South Wales.
Lot 16—BROWN FILLY, by Hotchkiss, dam Agnes, by St Leger out of Lovebird (imp), by Macaroni. This filly is particularly well grown; her breeding is sufficient recommendation.
Lot 17—BROWN COLT, by St Leger (imp), dam Hilda, by Musket from Ouida, by Yattendon. Hilda is the dam of Antares, winner of the Takapuna Cup 200 sovs, Sylvia Handicap 200 sovs, Victoria Handicap, Auckland Cup 1000 sovs, A.B.C. Handicap Hurdles, Napier Park Hurdles; and Fulmen, winner of Otago Cup and New Zealand Cup. This colt is well furnished, and has immense quarters and splendid legs, and should uphold the family reputation.
Lot 18—BROWN FILLY, by Hotchkiss, dam Aida, by Leolinus (imp) out of L'Orient, by Knight of the Crescent, out of Egyptian; by Touchstone. Aida is the dam of that great performer Impulse, winner of the Auckland B.C. Easter Handicap 800 sovs, Autumn Handicap, Wanganui Stakes 200 sovs; at 5 years won New Zealand Cup 1000 sovs. This filly is half sister to those good colts, Abel and Ulian, winners of many races. She is particularly well grown and furnished in every way like a two-year-old.
Lot 19—BROWN FILLY, by Hotchkiss, dam Vixen, by Castor (imp) out of Victress, by Vortex (son of Yattendon), dam Georgi, by Bishop of Osnaburg (imp). This is a first foal. She is well grown, and has great freedom of action.
Lot 20—CHESTNUT FILLY, by St Leger (imp), dam Lady Emily, by Castor (imp), out of Lady Wellington, by Musket (own sister to Derringer, now in England). This filly is full sister to Nobility, a winner and a promising colt.
Lot 21—BAY FILLY, by St Leger (imp), dam Cuiralba, by Cuirassier out of Albatross, by Malta out of The Auk, by The Marquis, winner of the Two Thousand Guineas and St Leger in England. Albatross is the dam of those great winners Tekanu Lochness, Elswick and Merganser. The breeding combination in this filly cannot be excelled.
Lot 22—CHESTNUT FILLY, by Hotchkiss, dam Chrysolite, by Castor (imp) out of Onyx, by Angler out of Chrysolite (imp) by Stockwell. This is a well grown and quality youngster, being from a daughter of Onyx, the dam of Nordenfeldt, and from appearances should develop into a beautiful mare.
Lot 23—BAY COLT, by Musketry, son of Maxim, out of imp. Sunningdale by the great English sire Hampton, out of Sally Port, by Theobald out of Fortress by Knight of Kars-Fascine, by Melbourne—Escalade, by Touchstone—Ghuznee, by Pantaloon. This is a big colt, all quality, and descended as he is from such a beautiful mare as Sunningdale, and by Maxim's best son, the Musket strain should prove a success. Sunnymora was sired by Light Artillery, a son of Trenton, a good performer in South Australia.
Lot 24—CHESTNUT COLT, by St Leger, imp, dam Armilla, by imp. Castor out of Necklace, dam of those good winners Cravat, winner of the A.J.C. Metropolitan Stakes; Collarette, a good winner. Coronet, winner of first-class races. Armilla, the dam of this colt, was also a great performer. Was the Canterbury Oaks, A.B.C. Musket Stakes, Nursery Handicap, Wanganui Two-year-old Stakes, and

the Wellington Exhibition Handicap and Shorts the same day, and also the Napier Park Railway Handicap
Lot 25—BAY COLT, by Castor, dam Yattaghan, by Nordenfeldt out of Yattacy, by Yattendon from Ecstasy, by the Marquis, imp, from Lady Exeter by New Warrior. This colt should commend himself to buyers on account of his fashionable breeding, having no less than nine strains of Touchstone blood, two of Stockwell, and two of Sir Hercules.
Lot 26—BAY FILLY, by St Leger, imp, dam Antelope, by Apremont, imp, from Miss Kate, imp, by Perkin Warbeck. This filly is own sister to Bluejacket, winner of the Auckland Cup and Great Northern Derby; she is all quality and beautifully shaped.

- Lot 1.—BAY FILLY, by Seaton Delaval out of Innisfail, by Nordenfeldt out of Inisthona, by Leonidas—Moulena, by Patriarch from Rosabella, by Panic. Innisfail is dam of St Innis, a winner. This filly is very smart. The form shown by the stock of Seaton Delaval is exceptional out of 13 of his progeny that have raced 12 have proved winners.
Lot 2.—BAY COLT, by St Leger out of Cantiniere, by Musket—Queen Bess by Nutwith out of daughter of Riddlesworth, by St Patrick. Cantiniere is the dam of Brown Bess, Woodstock, and other winners. This yearling colt is full brother to Woodstock, and is well grown.
Lot 3.—BAY FILLY, by Seaton Delaval out of Bragela by Panic out of Phillis, by Richelieu out of Phillip pine, by The Premier out of Matilda, by Zhrab. Bragela is dam of Ida, St Gordon, Grenadier, all good performers. This is a well-grown filly, and is full of quality. She shows good paddock form, and will come to hand early.
Lot 4.—BAY FILLY, by Seaton Delaval out of Miss Gladys, by Cuirassier out of Sybil (half-sister to St Leger), by Leolinus—Atlantis (imp). This filly is a first foal, and is very well grown. Her breeding cannot be surpassed, combining as she does the Musket, Fisherman and St Leger blood.
Lot 5.—CHESTNUT FILLY, by Seaton Delaval out of Charente, by Nordenfeldt, out of La Dauphine, by The Dauphin out of Brassolia by Panic out of Josephine, by Boiardo. Charente is dam of La Gloria, the winner of A.R.C. Guineas, Prince of Wales' Handicap, and City Handicap; also of Nonette, winner of Avondale Stakes, A.R.C. Welcome Stakes, and Musket Stakes. This is an exceedingly well-grown filly, and should command the attention of buyers in want of running blood.
Lot 6.—CHESTNUT COLT, by Seaton Delaval out of Waitemata, by Eridisford out of Aorere, by Chester out of Kaipara, by Goldsbrough from Maritana, by New Warrior from Mermaid, by Fisherman. Waitemata is dam of Sparkling Water, who ran second to Nonette in A.R.C. Welcome Stakes. This colt shows a lot of quality, and is well grown, and coming from such a sterling family should race well.
Lot 7.—BAY FILLY, by Seaton Delaval out of Liquidation, by King Cole out of Realisation, by Veaspian from Hopeful Duchess, by the Flying Dutchman. This yearling filly is full sister to Hastings, and shows promise of coming to hand very early, and should soon give a return on her outlay.
Lot 8.—CHESTNUT FILLY, by Seaton Delaval out of Leocant, by Leolinus out of Cantiniere, by Musket out of Queen Bess, by Nutwith. This filly is very well grown, and comes from a winning family.
Lot 9.—CHESTNUT FILLY, by St Hippo out of Jade-stone, by Sword Dance out of Onyx, by Angler out of Chrysolite, by Stockwell out of Juliet, by Touchstone. This yearling filly is exceedingly well grown, showing great size, and is full of quality. Being half-sister to that great performer Explosion, and by St Hippo, one of the best racehorses ever saddled in New Zealand, she should command the attention of buyers.
Lot 10.—CHESTNUT FILLY, by Seaton Delaval out of Campania, by Robinson Crusoe out of Campanilla, by Maribyrnong out of Silver Bell, full sister to Chester, by Yattendon—Lady Chester, by Stockwell. This yearling colt is full brother to Miss Delaval, winner of C.J.C. Oaks, A.R.C. Derby, and W.R.C. N.Z. St Leger Stakes. He is full of quality, and has every appearance of making a great racehorse.
Lot 11.—BAY COLT, by Seaton Delaval out of Miss Letty by St Leger out of Necklace, by Musket out of Locket (imp), by Thunderbolt out of Keepsake, by Daniel O'Rourke. Miss Letty is dam of Miss Rose, Laetitia, and Beddington, all good winners. This is a great colt, has plenty of size, and shows a lot of quality. He should both gallop fast and stay well.

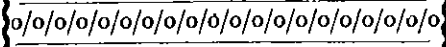

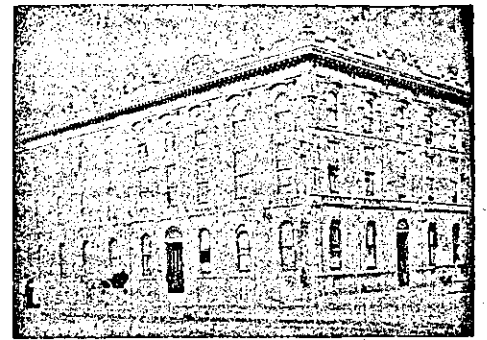
