SPRING MEETING.

FIRST DAY: SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 1, 1902.

PROGRAMME.

Maiden Trot Handicap of 25 sovs, saddle or harness; second horse to receive 5 sovs from the stake. For all horses that have never won an advertised trotting race exceeding 25 sovs in value at time of entry. Nomination, 10s; acceptance, 10s. Distance, one mile.

Stewards' Trot Handicap of 40 sovs, harness; second horse to receive 5 sovs from the stake. All horses will be handicapped to trot 2.50 or better to the mile. Nomination, 15s; acceptance, 15s. Distance, one mile and a-half.

October Handicap of 40 sovs; second horse to receive 5 sovs from the stake. For ponies 14 hands 3 inches and under. Nomination, 15s; acceptance, 15s. Distance, six and a-half furlongs.

Spring Trot Handicap of 60 sovs, saddle or harness; second horse to receive 10 sovs from the stake. All horses will be handicapped to trot 2.50 or better to the mile. The winner of the Stewards' Trot to receive a penalty of seven seconds behind its original start. Nomination, 1 sov; acceptance, 1 sov. Distance, two miles.

Pony Trot Handicap of 25 sovs; second horse to receive 5 sovs from the stake. For ponies 14 hands 2 inches and under. Nomination, 10s; acceptance, 10s. Distance, one mile and a-quarter.

Class Trot Handicap of 40 sovs, saddle or harness; second horse to receive 5 sovs from the stake. All horses will be handicapped to trot 2.46 or better to the mile. Nomination, 15s; acceptance, 15s. Distance, one mile and a-quarter.

Flying Handicap of 35 sovs; second horse to receive 5 sovs from the stake. For ponies 14 hands 3 inches and under. The winner of the October Handicap to receive a penalty of 7lb extra. Nomination, 10s; acceptance, 15s. Distance, five furlongs.

Electric Trot Handicap of 35 sovs, in saddle; second horse to receive 5 sovs from the stake. The winner of any race at the meeting to receive a penalty of five seconds behind its original start. Nomination, 10s; acceptance, 15s. Distance, one mile.

SECOND DAY:

WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 5, 1902.

Trial Trot Handicap of 25 sovs, saddle or harness; second horse to receive 5 sovs from the stake. For all horses that have not won an advertised trotting race exceeding 25 sovs in value at time of entry. Nomination, 10s; acceptance, 10s. Distance, one mile and a-half.

October Handicap Trot of 50 sovs, saddle or harness; second horse to receive 10 sovs from the stake. All horses will be handicapped to trot 2.50 or better to the mile. Nomination, 1 sov; acceptance, 1 sov. Distance, two miles.

Junction Handicap of 35 sovs; second horse to receive 5 sovs from the stake. For ponies 14 hands 3 inches and under. Nomination, 10s; acceptance, 15s. Distance, six and a-half furlongs.

Class Trot Handicap of 35 sovs, saddle or harness; second horse to receive 5 sovs from the stake. For horses that have never won a race at better than 2.43 to the mile at time of entry. All horses will be handicapped to trot 2.65 or better to the mile. The winner of the October Handicap to receive a penalty of seven seconds. Nomination, 10s; acceptance, 15s. Distance, one mile and a-half.

Harness Trot Handicap of 35 sovs; second horse to receive 5 sovs from the stake. All horses will be handicapped to trot 2.64 or better to the mile. The winner of the October or Class Trots to receive a penalty of five seconds. Nomination, 10s; acceptance, 15s. Distance, one mile and a-quarter.

Shorts' Handicap of 30 sovs; second horse to receive 5 sovs from the stake. For ponies 14 hands 3 inches and under. The winner of the Junction Handicap to receive a penalty of 7lb extra. Nomination, 10s; acceptance, 15s. Distance, five furlongs.

Telegraph Trot Handicap of 30 sovs, in saddle; second horse to receive 5 sovs from the stake. The winner of any race on the day to receive a penalty of five seconds. Nomination, 10s; acceptance, 15s. Distance, one mile.
