I hear that Snowy Sturgeon, who was recently beaten by Thompson for the Middle-Weight Championship of Australia, came over to New Zealand with Messrs Eales and Gorrick, the crack pigeon shots, with a view to recuperating for three months before tackling his conqueror again.

W. Lane was the most successful jockey in England this year, winning 170 races, next on the list coming W. Halsey 115, D. Maher 106, J. H. Martin 80, and T. Dixon and F. Hardy, 74 each. Lane was first heard of in 1899, when he rode one winner. The following year he scored twenty-nine times, last season he got up to forty-seven, and this year he is on top, so that his rise has been pretty rapid.
