W. Lane was the most successful jockey in England this year, winning 170 races, next on the list coming W. Halsey 115, D. Maher 106, J. H. Martin 80, and T. Dixon and F. Hardy, 74 each. Lane was first heard of in 1899, when he rode one winner. The following year he scored twenty-nine times, last season he got up to forty-seven, and this year he is on top, so that his rise has been pretty rapid. Several apprentices have come to the front this year, the most notable being T. Dixon, who from one win last season has gone up to seventy-four this. J. E. Watts, who had never previously ridden a winner was first forty-nine times this season, and was very in England this year, winning 170 races, forty-nine times this season, and was very little ahead of the two other newcomers to the winning list in C. Trigg forty-seven and T. L. Miller forty-five.
