

This Cover does away with the annoyance usually caused by ordinary covers becoming displaced, as in the case of a horse rolling.

There is no crupper used, consequently the horse does not suffer from chafing or cutting of the tail, which often causes lock-jaw. The mode of attachment is simplicity itself, viz., the straps for fastening going

round each hind leg, as shown in above drawing.
