DEMOSTHENES is a dark brown horse and greatly resembles his sire. He has a beautiful head, neck and shoulders, muscular loins and quarters, and is the embodiment of an ideal sire. During his turf career he won several races, including the Doncaster Spring Handicap and Stewards' Handicap at Epsom, and in each of his efforts displayed great pace and stamina, and is one of the best legged horses in the Dominion.

DESMOND is the sire of Craignour and Aboyeur, first and second in English Derby, the former being sold for £30,000 for stud purposes. He proved a brilliant two-year-old, winning five of six events. LOMOND, sold for £10,000, THE WHITE KNIGHT, winner of the Curragh Grand Prize, Ascot Gold Vase, Newbury Cup, March Stakes, Coronation Cup (twice), Ascot Gold Cup (twice) and Goodwood Cup; SIR ARCHIBALD, winner of the New Stakes, Chesterfield Stakes, Duchess of York Plate, Victoria Cup, Salford Borough Handicap, Rous Memorial Stakes, STORNOWAY, Fulbourne Stakes, HAPSBURG, winner of New Stakes, etc., sold for 3200 guineas as a yearling; LAND LEAGUE, winner of 33 races, including the Cambridgeshire Handicap and Chesterfield Cup, and CHARLES O'MALLEY are some of the good horses by Desmond. The last-named won four events consecutively at two years old, the Windsor Castle Stakes Ascot, Seaton Delaval Plate, Newcastle Richmond Stakes Goodwood, and Autumn Breeders' Plate at Manchester. Earla Mor, Athi and Beau are amongst the successful sires got by Desmond.

Desmond's stock between 1903 and up to the time of his death in 1913 had won 359 races worth £138,277, and he then headed the list of winning sires in England, and his two next seasons were at the time booked up at 250 guineas per made. To date his progeny have won about £180,000.

CARLIN, dam of Demosthenes and Peter the Hermit, comes of a splendid line, which includes Miami (Oaks), Mary Stuart (Oaks and St. Leger), Merry Gal, The Palmer, Rosicrucian, Galtee More, Ard Patrick, Morion, Winkfield, Johnny Morgan, Sunstar, White Star, Marayax, Princess Dorrie (2000 Guineas, Oaks), and numerous other great winners in England, while in the colonies there are many branches of the same line that have sent forth numerous winners. In New Zealand such highly successful horses as Stepniak, Nelson, Capapie, Freedom, Tirailleur, Merry England, San Fran, Provocation, Menschikoff, Patron, Paritutu, Paisano, Expect, Mahaki, and Reputation come from the same tap root, and such great mares as Steppe, Rupee, Stepfeldt, Mergauser, Spade Guinea Apropos, She (dam of Bobadil), Pibroch, Parera, Lady Norah, and scores of others.

LUCULLUS' pedigree is fairly studied with celebrated names. His sire Ard Patrick (sold for 20,000 guineas), won the Derby, and he is a grandson of the famous St. Simon, whose progeny won over £500,000 in stakes. His dam, Lucca, won the German Oaks of 5000sovs. and her sire Cazabat, is a son of Ruell (winner of the Grand Prix de Paris). Sir Beys, the sire of Lucerna, won the Derby, as also did Favonius, Sir Bevy's sire, and Kisber and Voltiguer, who follow in the pedigree also have their names enrolled amongst winners of the great Epsom race.

MERRY MOMENT (5).**

COUNT SCHOMBERG—MERRY GAL.  
MERRY MOMENT won the Astley Plate, Newmarket, the Anglesey Stakes (six furlongs), and His Majesty's Plate, Curragh (2½ miles). He ran second in 53rd Triennial Ascot for two-year-olds, beating Lally, Bridge of Canny, Troutbeck, and Gorgos, and was third to Plymetus in Princess of Wales Stakes, of £5000. He was placed in numerous good races, beating good horses, such as Pcton, Royal Dream and Succory.  
COUNT SCHOMBERG, his sire, ran third in Cesarewitch, also Cambridgeshire, and second in Manchester Handicap, won Autuill Hurdle Race, Ellesmere Stakes, Goodwood Cup, twice Liverpool Autumn Cup, Queen's Plate, Derby, Chester Cup, Gold Vase, Ascot, Hurdle Race, Manchester, fourth Grand National Steeplechase, Paris, and won New Century Steeplechase. Amongst the good horses sired by him were Cocksure II, Black Arrow, Pom, Carrickfergus, Decision. His record as a sire to 1914 was £52,550.

MERRY GAL, his dam (winner of Princess of Wales Stakes of £10,000, second in the Oaks, and stakes amounting to £13,364), by Galopin out of Mary Seaton, by Isonomy—Marie Stuart (Oaks and Leger), and half sister to Lady Morgan, the granddam of Ard Patrick and Galtee More. White Eagle, out of Merry Gal, won £15,323 in stakes, and sired winners of £9655 in his first season at the stud, amongst them Let Fly, who ran second in the Derby.

MERRY MOMENT will stand at Soutra, Hastings, Hawke's Bay, at a fee of 20 GUINEAS, Grazing Free and no Groomage. Wet mares will have the advantage of being grazed on freshly laid-down, rich alluvial paddocks.


