2. MAIDEN HACK RACE of 65sovs; second horse to receive 10sovs from the stake. For three-year-olds and upwards. For horses that have never won an advertised race of 40sovs or over.

3. WELTER HACK HANDICAP of 70 sovs; second horse to receive 10 sovs from the stake. Minimum weight, 8.7. Nomination 35s. Five furlongs.

4. PAHIATUA HANDICAP (Open) of 120sovs; second horse to receive 15sovs, and third horse 5sovs from the stake. Nomination 20s., acceptance 40s. One mile and a quarter.

5. HACK AND HUNTERS' STEEPLECHASE of 85sovs; second horse to receive 10sovs, and third horse 5 sovs from the stake. Nomination 15s., acceptance 30s. About two miles, over such course as the Stewards may direct.

6. HACK FLYING HANDICAP of 70 sovs; second horse to receive 10 sovs from the stake. Nomination 15s., acceptance 20s. Six furlongs.

7. TELEPHONE HANDICAP (Open) of 90sovs; second horse to receive 10 sovs, and third horse 5sovs from the stake. Nomination 15s., acceptance 30s. Five furlongs.

Hurdle Races.—The winner of any Hurdle Race or Steeplechase after the declaration of weights to carry 10lb penalty in the Hurdle Race or Steeplechase, or two or more Hurdle Races or Steeplechases 21lb penalty.

2. HUKANUI HACK HANDICAP of 45 sovs; second horse to receive 5sovs from the stake. Nomination 10s., acceptance 12s. 6d. Seven furlongs.

3. WOODLANDS HUNT HANDICAP STEEPLECHASE of 65sovs; second horse to receive 10sovs, and third horse 5sovs from the stake. For qualified hunters only. Minimum weight, 10.7. Nomination 15s., acceptance 17s. 6d. About two miles and a-half, over such course as the Stewards may direct.

7. HUNTERS' HANDICAP FLAT RACE of 35sovs; second horse to receive 5sovs from the stake. For qualified hunters only. Minimum weight, 10.7. Gentlemen riders. Nomination 7s. 6d., acceptance 10s. One mile and a quarter.

8. HACK SCURRY of 40sovs; second horse to receive 5sovs from the stake. For horses that have never won an advertised race exceeding the value of 20sovs. Minimum weight, 8.7. Nomination 20s. Five furlongs.

AUTUMN MEETING, FEBRUARY, 1918.

FOURTH TARANAKI STAKES of 500 sovs; second horse to receive 100 sovs, and the third horse 50sovs out of the stakes. For horses two-year-old and upwards at time of starting. Weight for age, with penalties and allowances.
