A great number of Auck-land sportsmen journeyed through in the special train, whilst from far and near the residents of surrounding dis-tricts assembled for a thorough after-noon's enjoyment. Every credit is due to the secretary, Mr. A. J. Bray, and the hard-working officials, who toiled hard and succeeded in making the gathering a pronounced success. The totalisator staff under the efficient man-agement of Messrs. Blomfield and Co. handled the large sum of £12,925 10s. During the afternoon a handsome cup, presented by Messrs. H. H. Robertson and E. J. Ralph-Smith was handed to Mr. R. Barlow, owner of Depredation, winner of the Te Awamutu Cup, while the winner of the Waipa Stakes, was also the recipient of a cup donated by Mr. J. C. Montefiore. The president of the Waipa Racing Club, Mr. R. R. Hockley, congratulated the fortunate owners. The racing proved highly in-teresting, each event attracting a good ield. A splendid field lined up for the

field. A splendid field lined up for the opening event—the Waipa Stakes—Bez-mar, Wake Up, Kiriwinning and Bing-ham being backed in that order. The last-named was early in the lead, and won easily by four lengths from the favourite and Sylvan Knight, the trio being well clear of their field at the finish.
