CHINEMURI JOCKEY CLUB.

ANNUAL MEETING.

The officials of the Ohinemuri Jockey Club have now made known the details in connection with the programme of their annual race meeting which takes place on the Paeroa racecourse on March 17 and 19. This go ahead club have drawn up an excellent two days' programme, which is certain to ensure a large number of horses visiting Paeroa about the middle of next month. The Ohinemuri Cup Hand cap, of 250sovs, 11/4 miles, to be decided on the opening day, is one of the most coveted events with owners who made a point of attending the country fixtures, and a particularly good entry may safely be counted upon. The principal event on the second day will be the Paeroa Handicap, of 150sovs, 1 mile, when another strong field of handicap horses should again line up at the post. A feature of this popular meeting at Paeroa is the inclusion of a steeplechase on each day of the fixture, and both events should fill well when nominations come to be taken on Saturday week (February 17). The other races include sprint, hack, hurdle and welter events, making the programme

attractive to the smaller trainers, who can be relied upon to assemble in strong force at Paeroa next month.

THE BUSHY PARK STUD TO BE DISPERSED.

An important item of news this week comes to us from Mr. J. Hay, manager of Mr. G. F. Moore's thoroughbred stud at Bushy Park, Kai Iwi, Wanganui, informing us that this successful breeder of pedigreed stock, in consequence of the war, has decided on going right out of thoroughbred horses, and will sell his complete stud of mares in foal to Hallowmas and with foals at foot by that sire, and also that fine sire, in May next, about the time of the Wanganui Jockey Club's winter meeting. Hailowmas will be sold subject to a booking of thirty mares already arranged for. Particulars of the sale will be announced in due course, when it will be seen that some very choice lots will come under the hammer. It was at Bushy Park that Bisogne, Dusky Morn, S'gnor, Nor'-west and quite a host of useful horses were bred, and the dispersal of the stud will be generally regretted. 

style when he beat Bisogne in the Egmont Stakes at a difference of 1lb. in weight. The time, 1m'n, 13 2-5sec., with the weight, 9.11, suggests that the performance was out of the critinary. It is possible that Egypt, Tete-atete and Bimeter were each realty fitter than when they raced at Ellerslie, and that the racing at Trentham did them further good, but it is sometimes surprising how the difference in the company counts. There is no reason to suggest, however, that the'r trainers really had these horses more thoroughly ready than they were at Ellerslie, though we all know what racing does for most horses, fitting them for their races better than all the work they get in private. Each of those named raced the week previously at Trentham, but Bisogne had been allowed an easier time.

Phil Green took Lady Sefton to Wellington for the trotting meeting there, but the mare failed to run up to expectations and fin'shed out of a place (writes our Wanganui correspondent). The race should do her good, however, and by the time the Wanganui meeting comes round she should be in tip-top fettle. Green's other horses, The Weaver and Greywood, are doing steady work, and will be seen in action at Wanganui.
