

by a couple of lengths, Draft being half a length away, third.

With only Analogue and Master Lupin engaged in the Atkinson Memorial Stakes very little interest was centred in the big handicap event of the afternoon. Analogue carried about £130 more on the machine than the son of Lupin, the investments not being of a very brisk nature. Analogue took the lead from the start, and though when half the distance had been covered Master Lupin raced up to his rival, it was only a momentary flash, as Analogue soon raced away again and scored a three-quarters of a length victory in comfortable fashion. After the race G. Clarke (rider of Analogue) was called before the stewards and fined £5 for crossing Master Lupin at the start of the race.

Of the twenty acceptors for the Maiden Hack Scurry, Army Service was the only one to decline his engagement. May Morn, a five-year-old mare by Formative—Gold Reef, on whom H. Young had the mount, was elected a hot favourite, while Carmel Arch and Westella were the only others to be given serious consideration. Pergola and Westella shot out in advance of a bunched field, and practically had the race to themselves, the former winning by a length from Westella, with Carmel Arch a length away, third.

Bisogne, Egypt and Nystad were saddled up for the Hawera Stakes, favourite's resting with the Egmont Cup winner, who carried nearly double the amount invested upon Bisogne's number, while Nystad's chance was not taken seriously. Bisogne left the mark smartest of the trio, and led for several furlongs from the favourite, but the latter had a commanding lead as the straight was entered, and although Bisogne's rider endeavoured to get up on terms with the son of All Black he found it an impossible task, Egypt winning easily by four lengths. Nystad was three lengths away, third. Egypt is at present in great heart, and should make a good showing if started in some of the big handicaps at the autumn meetings.

Pohehe was elected a pronounced favourite for the Inaha Hack Flat, with Cora Ora, May Morn and Revocation next in demand. Cora Ora had charge of affairs early in the race, being closely attended by Revocation, and it looked as if the pair would have the issue to themselves, until C. Price brought Dingle along with a late run and gained a half-length victory from Revocation, who was a similar distance in front of Cora Ora. Pohehe was fourth. The winner, despite his second to Deeside in the Waipapa Hack Flat the previous day, was allowed to pay a sterling price on the machine.

The Highden representative, Sunny Climes, was a strong order for the Normanby Welter, in which there were only four starters, Zetes being second choice. The latter soon opened up a gap from his three opponents, and had no difficulty in winning by four lengths from the favourite, who finished strongly, with Ratana three lengths away, third.
