In the Te Kuiti Cup, of 10 furlongs, nothing looks better at the weight than Rebel (8.), which ran well in good company at the A.R.C. summer gathering. Te Papapa (7.13) and Toro-toro (7.12) are also well treated. In the Hack Hurdle Race Glendal-ough (9.9) and Kaiwhakahaere (9.6) look like making a match of the race. Merry Dan (9.6) was not well when he ran at the Shore meeting. Spai-spire is fast and a good jumper, but a non-stayer. Last Saturday's winners, Mill o' Gowrie (8.8) Keystone (8.6), Glittering
