

AUCKLAND'S TWO-YEAR-OLDS ON PARADE.

There are probably more two-year-olds in training in New Zealand this year than ever there were and that should be accepted as a healthy sigh. There have been quite as many in previous years in the province of Auckland, however. There were 27 entered for the Two-year-old Parade at Ellerslie on Saturday, which was engineered by the North Island Owners and Trainers' Association very nicely, probably because it did not occur to anyone else that it would be as well to give the youngsters a spin up with colours on before they have to go into battle. The Auckland Racing Club lent their course, barrier, starter (Mr. C. O'Connor), judge (Mr. R. Lusk) and carctaker (Mr. A. Hill). Their newly appointed handicapper (Mr. F. Macmanemin) and their secretary (Mr. J. F. Hartland) also gave a hand. The secretary of the Association (Mr. A. L. Raven), and the various owners and trainers (some of whom acted as timers) all seemed very well pleased with the arrangements. The afternoon could not have been more pleasant, and there was a muster of probably 400 people cutside those associated with the stables, mostly well-known sports (young and middle aged), who keenly enjoyed the outing, though they had some difficulty in making out which was which of the youngsters. Each wore numbered saddle cloths, but only a comparatively few of those present had lists giving the names and breeding of the starters in each division. Twelve started in the first and thirteen in the second division, making 25 in all. Some of the riders rode in each event. There were 18 horsemen, about half the number being apprentices, and some of them had a big advantage in weight over others. A number of the youngsters seem to be pretty well forward, fairly smart and well accustomed to the barrier through constant lessons thereat, and acquitted themselves very well. A number carried considerably over what they will have to carry in their first engagements and a number well under.
