

The Triumphal March of Victory through London---American and Indian Troops with their Colours and Standards.

BANNERS BEING BORNE BY INDIANS AND BRITISH TOMMIES WHO HAVE SERVED IN THE EAST IN THE GREAT VICTORY PROCESSION THROUGH THE STREETS OF LONDON. The men are shown dipping their banners as they pass the Cenotaph in Whitehall, which monument to the dead is crowned with a great laurel wreath, while its base is strewn with floral tributes to the memory of the fallen heroes.
